A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators – Nonlicensed Persons – Provisional Licensure

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the owner of a nursing home or other appropriate nursing $\mathbf{5}$ home authority, under certain circumstances, to immediately appoint a nonlicensed 6 person to serve in the capacity of interim, instead of acting, nursing home 7 administrator; authorizing the appointed nonlicensed person to act as the interim 8 nursing home administrator on filing an application with the State Board of 9 Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators requesting a certain provisional license; 10 authorizing the Board to issue a provisional license to a certain applicant if a certain 11 determination is made; providing for the period during which the provisional license 12remains in effect; providing that if the Board denies an application for a provisional 13 license, the nonlicensed person shall immediately cease acting as the interim nursing 14 home administrator and the owner of the nursing home or other appropriate nursing 15home authority, under certain circumstances, shall immediately appoint another 16nonlicensed person to act as the interim nursing home administrator; requiring the 17nonlicensed person to file an application for a provisional license with the Board; 18 altering the circumstances under which the Board may extend the period during 19which a certain person may act as an interim nursing home administrator under a 20provisional license; clarifying language; and generally relating to the licensure of 21nursing home administrators by the State Board of Examiners of Nursing Home 22Administrators.

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Health Occupations

4 9-301.

5 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an individual shall be licensed 6 by the Board before the individual may practice as a nursing home administrator in this 7 State.

8 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, if a licensee 9 leaves or is removed from a position as a nursing home administrator by death or for any 10 other unexpected cause, the owner of the nursing home or other appropriate nursing home 11 authority shall immediately:

12(i)Designate a licensed nursing home administrator to serve in that13capacity; and

14 (ii) Notify the Board of the designated licensed nursing home 15 administrator's name.

16 (2) (i) **1.** In the event a LICENSED nursing home administrator is 17 not available, the owner or other appropriate nursing home authority [may] SHALL 18 IMMEDIATELY appoint a nonlicensed person to serve in the capacity of [acting] INTERIM 19 nursing home administrator.

20 2. THE APPOINTED NONLICENSED PERSON MAY ACT AS 21 THE INTERIM NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR ON FILING AN APPLICATION WITH 22 THE BOARD REQUESTING A PROVISIONAL LICENSE TO PRACTICE AS THE INTERIM 23 NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR for a period not to exceed 90 days.

(ii) **1.** The owner or other appropriate nursing home authority shall immediately notify the Board of the appointment and forward the credentials of the person appointed to the Board for evaluation to assure that the person appointed is experienced, trained, and competent.

28 **2.** THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A PROVISIONAL LICENSE TO 29 THE APPLICANT IF THE BOARD DETERMINES, IN ITS DISCRETION, THAT THE 30 APPLICANT IS OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AND CAPABLE OF ADEQUATELY 31 ADMINISTERING THE NURSING HOME FOR THE PROVISIONAL PERIOD.

323.IF THE BOARD DENIES AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED33IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBPARAGRAPH (I)2 OF THIS PARAGRAPH:

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1 THE NONLICENSED PERSON SHALL IMMEDIATELY A. $\mathbf{2}$ CEASE ACTING AS THE INTERIM NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR; AND В. 3 IF A LICENSED NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR 4 REMAINS UNAVAILABLE, THE OWNER OR OTHER APPROPRIATE NURSING HOME $\mathbf{5}$ AUTHORITY SHALL IMMEDIATELY APPOINT ANOTHER NONLICENSED PERSON TO ACT AS THE INTERIM NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR. 6 74. A PERSON APPOINTED UNDER SUBSUBPARAGRAPH 3 8 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH SHALL FILE AN APPLICATION FOR A PROVISIONAL LICENSE 9 WITH THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PARAGRAPH. 10 The 90-day period begins on the date that the licensee leaves or (iii) 11 is removed from the position as a nursing home administrator. 12(iv) The Board, ON REQUEST AND FOR GOOD CAUSE SHOWN, may 13extend the 90-day period for a further period of not more than 30 days. 14(3)A licensed nursing home administrator designated under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall submit to a criminal history records check in accordance with § 15169–302.1 of this subtitle. 17(4) A person appointed in accordance with paragraph (2) of this subsection 18 shall submit to a criminal history records check in accordance with § 9-302.1 of this 19 subtitle. 20The Board may deny approval of an appointment under paragraph (1) (5)or (2) of this subsection based on the results of a criminal history records check required 2122under paragraph (3) or (4) of this subsection after consideration of the factors listed in § 239-308(b)(1) of this subtitle. 24Paragraphs (3) and (4) of this subsection do not apply to a person (6)25licensed by a health occupations board who previously has completed a criminal history 26records check required for licensure. 27SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28October 1, 2017.
