SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (a) Any penalty imposed under this section does not apply to an individual who 17 kills or wounds a black bear in defense of the individual's own life, the lives of other 18 individuals, or the lives of animals, INCLUDING BEES IN A BEE COLONY, on the 19 individual's property.

20 (b) If the Secretary adopts any regulation, including an emergency regulation, 21 under § 10–205 of this title or § 10–405 of this subtitle to prohibit the hunting, possessing, 22 selling, purchasing, shipping, carrying, transporting, or exporting of black bears, a person 23 who violates the regulation is subject to the following penalties:

1 (1) For a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$1,500, imprisonment not 2 exceeding 6 months, or both; and

3 (2) For a second or subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$2,000, 4 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year, or both.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 6 1, 2017.
