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Optometrists and Physicians - Prescriptions for Lenses - Expiration Dates

- FOR the purpose of requiring that certain optometrists and certain physicians ensure that prescriptions for certain lenses contain an expiration date of not more than a certain number of months from a certain date; requiring that certain optometrists and certain physicians, under certain circumstances, enter certain information into a patient's medical record and provide a patient with a certain explanation; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to expiration dates for prescriptions for lenses.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Health Occupations
- 18 **11–404.5.**
- 19 (A) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PRESCRIPTION FOR CONTACT 20 LENSES.
- 21 (B) A LICENSED OPTOMETRIST SHALL:
- 22 (1) Ensure that a prescription for eyeglasses, sunglasses,
- 23 OR ANY OTHER TYPE OF LENSES THAT THE OPTOMETRIST IS AUTHORIZED TO



- 1 PRESCRIBE CONTAINS AN EXPIRATION DATE FOR THE PRESCRIPTION OF NOT MORE
- 2 THAN 24 MONTHS FROM THE DATE THE PATIENT WAS FIRST EXAMINED; AND
- 3 (2) IF THE PRESCRIPTION CONTAINS AN EXPIRATION DATE OF LESS
- 4 THAN 24 MONTHS FROM THE DATE THE PATIENT WAS FIRST EXAMINED:
- 5 (I) ENTER INTO THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD THE VALID
- 6 CLINICAL REASONS FOR THE SHORTER EXPIRATION DATE; AND
- 7 (II) PROVIDE THE PATIENT WITH A WRITTEN AND AN ORAL
- 8 EXPLANATION OF THE CLINICAL REASONS FOR THE SHORTER EXPIRATION DATE.

- 10 (A) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PRESCRIPTION FOR CONTACT
- 11 LENSES.
- 12 (B) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN SHALL:
- 13 (1) ENSURE THAT A PRESCRIPTION FOR EYEGLASSES, SUNGLASSES,
- 14 OR ANY OTHER TYPE OF LENSES THAT THE PHYSICIAN IS AUTHORIZED TO
- 15 PRESCRIBE CONTAINS AN EXPIRATION DATE FOR THE PRESCRIPTION OF NOT MORE
- 16 THAN 24 MONTHS FROM THE DATE THE PATIENT WAS FIRST EXAMINED; AND
- 17 (2) If the prescription contains an expiration date of less
- 18 THAN 24 MONTHS FROM THE DATE THE PATIENT WAS FIRST EXAMINED:
- 19 (I) ENTER INTO THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL RECORD THE VALID
- 20 CLINICAL REASONS FOR THE SHORTER EXPIRATION DATE; AND
- 21 (II) PROVIDE THE PATIENT WITH A WRITTEN AND AN ORAL
- 22 EXPLANATION OF THE CLINICAL REASONS FOR THE SHORTER EXPIRATION DATE.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 October 1, 2017.
