1 AN ACT concerning

Plumbing and Heating, Ventilation, Air–Conditioning, and Refrigeration Inspectors – Qualifications

4 FOR the purpose of providing a certain exception to the authority of a county or local $\mathbf{5}$ government to employ only certain plumbing inspectors under certain 6 circumstances; authorizing a county or local government to hire certain inspectors if 7 the inspector obtains certain certification within a certain period of time and works 8 under certain supervision under certain circumstances; providing that certain 9 inspectors may be employed only if certain experience has been obtained; and generally relating to plumbing and heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and 10 11 refrigeration inspectors.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

1 (b) (1) Except as provided in [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of 2 this subsection, a county or local government may employ an individual as a plumbing 3 inspector only if the individual holds a master plumber license issued by the Board, the 4 Baltimore County Plumbing Board, or the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission.

5 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection does not apply to a county or local 6 government that uses combination building code inspectors to conduct concurrent 7 trade-specific inspections on residential or commercial buildings to determine compliance 8 with adopted plumbing codes and building codes if the combination building code inspector, 9 as part of the inspector's training, has passed:

(i) a master plumber examination given by the Board, the Baltimore
 County Plumbing Board, or the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission; or

(ii) the plumbing inspector's test administered by the Board.

(3) (1) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
A COUNTY OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY HIRE A PLUMBING INSPECTOR WHO DOES
NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE
PLUMBING INSPECTOR OBTAINS CERTIFICATION BY THE INTERNATIONAL CODE
COUNCIL AS A MECHANICAL INSPECTOR FOR RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL
BUILDINGS WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF BEING HIRED.

(II) A PLUMBING INSPECTOR HIRED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I)
 OF THIS PARAGRAPH MAY NOT WORK WITHOUT SUPERVISION UNTIL THE PLUMBING
 INSPECTOR RECEIVES INTERNATIONAL CODE COUNCIL CERTIFICATION.

(4) A PLUMBING INSPECTOR EMPLOYED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION
 MAY BE EMPLOYED ONLY IF THE INDIVIDUAL HAS EXPERIENCE AS A PLUMBER FOR
 AT LEAST 5 YEARS.

30 [(1)] (I) each year attend a continuing education course that the Board 31 or, with the approval of the Board, a county or local government conducts; and

(2) $\mathbf{5}$ EACH INSPECTOR APPOINTED OR EMPLOYED UNDER PARAGRAPH 6 (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE APPOINTED OR EMPLOYED ONLY IF THE 7**INSPECTOR** HAS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING HEATING, VENTILATION, AIR-CONDITIONING, AND REFRIGERATION SERVICES FOR AT LEAST 5 YEARS. 8 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

10 October 1, 2017.
