1 AN ACT concerning

Workgroup to Study the Implementation of Universal Access to Prekindergarten for 4–Year–Olds

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study the Implementation of Universal Access to Prekindergarten for 4–Year–Olds; providing for the composition, chair, and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving 7 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations regarding certain 8 9 matters; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to a 10 certain Commission on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this 11 Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study the Implementation of Universal Access to Prekindergarten for 12 134-Year-Olds.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,15 That:

16 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study the Implementation of Universal Access to 17 Prekindergarten for 4–Year–Olds.

18 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the composition of the 19 Workgroup shall be determined by the State Department of Education.

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(2) The State Department of Education shall include <u>in the Workgroup</u>:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2017 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2018, from the date it is enacted and, at the end of the 1-year period, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
