Presidential Candidate Tax Transparency Act

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain candidates for President or Vice President of the 4 United States to file copies of certain federal income tax returns and written consent 5 for the disclosure of those federal income tax returns with the State Board of 6 Elections by a certain date before a presidential general election; requiring the State 7 Board to make federal income tax returns filed by candidates for President or 8 Vice President of the United States publicly available on the State Board's Web site; 9 prohibiting the name of a candidate for President or Vice President of the United States who fails to satisfy the requirements of this Act from appearing on the general 10 11 election ballot; and generally relating to requiring candidates for President or 12 Vice President of the United States to disclose their federal income tax returns as a 13 condition for appearing on the general election ballot.

- 2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN" HAS THE MEANING 3 STATED IN § 6103(B)(1) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986.
- 4 (B) NO LATER THAN 65 DAYS BEFORE A PRESIDENTIAL GENERAL ELECTION,
- 5 A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF PRESIDENT OR VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED
- 6 STATES WHO IS NOT A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE SHALL FILE WITH THE STATE BOARD:
- 7 (1) A COPY OF THE CANDIDATE'S FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN FOR
- 8 AT LEAST THE 5 MOST RECENT TAXABLE YEARS FOR WHICH THE CANDIDATE FILED
