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1	WHEREAS, Those involved in sports, including coaches, players, and fans at all
2	levels, should promote good sportsmanship and foster the development of positive
3	characteristics in all individuals; and

- WHEREAS, In order to encourage and support these actions, the characteristics of respect, fairness, integrity, responsibility, and perseverance are considered reflective of good sportsmanship; and
- WHEREAS, Respect is treating others the way you want to be treated, tolerating differences, considering the feelings of others, dealing peacefully with anger, insults, and disagreements, and taking care of the environment; and
- WHEREAS, Fairness is playing by the rules, being open—minded, listening to others, not taking advantage of others, and taking personal responsibility for mistakes; and
- WHEREAS, Integrity is playing with honor, being humble in victory and graceful in defeat, being truthful and trustworthy, having the courage to do the right thing, being reliable, building a good reputation, and being loyal to your team and coaches; and
- WHEREAS, Responsibility is doing what is expected of you, being self-disciplined, thinking before you act, considering the consequences of your actions, and being accountable for your choices; and
- WHEREAS, Perseverance is always doing your best, demonstrating a positive attitude, and never giving up; and
- WHEREAS, A number of local recreation and parks departments across the State have successfully implemented sportsmanship months at the local level; and
- WHEREAS, It is critical that good sportsmanship be developed and recognized in order to ensure a quality sports environment for all involved; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7–503 through 7–506, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–504 through 7–507,

- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
