BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health Occupations Section 14–302 Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health Occupations

3 4 5 6 7	(1) SUBJECT TO THE RULES, REGULATIONS, AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD, A MEDICAL STUDENT OR AN INDIVIDUAL IN A POSTGRADUATE MEDICAL TRAINING PROGRAM THAT IS APPROVED BY THE BOARD, WHILE PERFORMING THE ASSIGNED DUTIES AT ANY OFFICE OF A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, HOSPITAL, CLINIC, OR SIMILAR FACILITY; AND

25 26 27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths

of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall
