AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 31,</u> 17 <u>2017, the Baltimore City Council shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with</u> 18 § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on the logistical and financial assistance that 19 the Baltimore City Council provides to Baltimore City Public Schools in accordance with 20 Section 1 of this Act.

# 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 22 1, 2017.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
