- 8 (c) A group that loses its status as a political party may regain that status only 9 by complying with all the requirements for qualifying as a new party under 4–102 of this subtitle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
