On conviction of a violation of § 3–304, § 3–306, § 3–307, § 3–310, or § 3–312 of this subtitle, a person who has been convicted on a prior occasion not arising from the same incident of any violation of §§ 3–303 through 3–306 of this subtitle] is subject to imprisonment not exceeding life IF THE PERSON HAS BEEN CONVICTED ON A PRIOR OCCASION NOT ARISING FROM THE SAME INCIDENT:

(b) If the State intends to proceed against a person under this section, it shall comply with the procedures set forth in the Maryland Rules for the indictment and trial of a subsequent offender.
