## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – U-47700 (“Pink”) – Prohibition**

3 FOR the purpose of listing a certain synthetic opioid on Schedule I to designate it a  
4 controlled dangerous substance that may not be legally used, possessed, or  
5 distributed; and generally relating to controlled dangerous substances.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Criminal Law**

14 5-402.

15 (c) (1) These opium derivatives are substances listed in Schedule I:

16 (i) acetorphine;

17 (ii) acetyldihydrocodeine;

18 (iii) acetylocodone;

19 (iv) benzylmorphine;

20 (v) codeine methylbromide;

6 (2) Unless specifically excepted under this subtitle, a salt, isomer, or salt  
7 of an isomer of a substance listed in this subsection is a Schedule I substance if the existence  
8 of the salt, isomer, or salt of an isomer is possible within the specific chemical designation.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
10 1, 2017.
