1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Libraries – Reorganization of Governance Structure**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland State Library Agency and the Maryland
4 State Library Board; transferring the duties and responsibilities of the Division of
5 Library Development and Services in the State Department of Education to the State
6 Library Agency; transferring the duties and responsibilities of the State Board of
7 Education pertaining to libraries to the State Library Board; making the
8 appointment of the State Librarian subject to the advice and consent of the Senate;
9 providing that the Maryland State Library Agency is the central State library
10 agency; providing that the head of the State Library Agency is the State Librarian;
11 providing for the appointment, term, qualifications, and salary of the State
12 Librarian; authorizing the State Library Agency to employ certain individuals;

 27 policies, orders, and other directives, forms, plans, memberships, contracts, property,
 28 investigations, and administrative and judicial responsibilities; providing that this
 29 Act may not affect the terms of certain members of the Maryland Advisory Council
 30 on Libraries; requiring the publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland, in
 31 consultation with the Department of Legislative Services, to correct cross-references
 32 and terminology in the Code that are rendered incorrect by this Act; making the
 33 provisions of this Act severable; defining certain terms; making certain technical
 34 changes; making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to a
 35 reorganization of the library governance structure in Maryland.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Education**

21 **23–101.**

22 (A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
23 INDICATED.

24 (B) “STATE LIBRARY AGENCY” MEANS THE MARYLAND STATE LIBRARY
25 AGENCY.

26 (C) “STATE LIBRARY BOARD” MEANS THE MARYLAND STATE LIBRARY
27 BOARD.

28 **[23–101.] 23–102.**

29 (a) The General Assembly finds:

30 (1) That public library resources and services are essential components of
31 the educational system; and

32 (2) That libraries stimulate awareness and understanding of critical social
33 issues, and assist individuals in reaching their highest potential for self–development.

1 (b) It is the policy of this State:

2 (1) To continue the orderly development and maintenance of library
3 facilities and services throughout this State, in collaboration with the counties; and

4 (2) To develop coordinated programs and services among libraries and
5 institutions to:

6 (i) Provide the widest possible access to the library and information
7 resources of this State; and

8 (ii) Insure more effective and economical services to all library users.

9 **[23-102.] 23-103.**

10 There is a [Division of Library Development and Services in the Department] **STATE**
11 **LIBRARY AGENCY AND A STATE LIBRARY BOARD**. The [Division] **STATE LIBRARY**
12 **AGENCY** is the central State library agency.

13 **[23-103.] 23-104.**

14 (a) The head of the [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE**
15 **LIBRARY AGENCY** is the [Assistant Superintendent for Libraries] **STATE LIBRARIAN**,
16 who is appointed by the State **LIBRARY** Board **WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE**
17 **SENATE** [on the recommendation of the State Superintendent].

18 (b) The [Assistant Superintendent for Libraries] **STATE LIBRARIAN** shall:

19 (1) Hold an advanced degree in library and information service;

20 (2) Have administrative experience in libraries; and

21 (3) Have any other qualifications the State [Superintendent] **LIBRARY**
22 **BOARD** considers necessary.

23 **(C) THE STATE LIBRARIAN SHALL:**

24 **(1) SELECT, ORGANIZE, AND DIRECT THE STAFF OF THE STATE**
25 **LIBRARY AGENCY;**

26 **(2) PERFORM THE DUTIES THE STATE LIBRARY BOARD ASSIGNS;**

27 **(3) SEE THAT THE POLICIES AND DECISIONS OF THE STATE LIBRARY**
28 **BOARD ARE CARRIED OUT; AND**

1 **(4) SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE STATE LIBRARY BOARD.**

2 **(D) THE STATE LIBRARIAN IS ENTITLED TO THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE**
3 **STATE BUDGET.**

4 **[(c)] (E) (1)** The [Division] **STATE LIBRARY AGENCY** may employ the
5 professional and clerical staff provided in the State budget.

6 (2) Each employee of the [Division] **STATE LIBRARY AGENCY** is entitled
7 to the salary provided in the State budget.

8 **(3) EACH EMPLOYEE OF THE STATE LIBRARY AGENCY SHALL JOIN**
9 **THE TEACHERS' PENSION SYSTEM OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND OR THE**
10 **EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND.**

11 **[23-104.] 23-105.**

12 (a) In addition to the other powers granted and duties imposed by this article, the
13 State **LIBRARY** Board has the powers and duties set forth in this section.

14 **(B) THE STATE LIBRARY BOARD SHALL APPOINT THE STATE LIBRARIAN.**

15 **[(b)] (C)** The State **LIBRARY** Board shall exercise general direction and control
16 of library development in this State and may:

17 (1) Adopt rules and regulations necessary to administer this title;

18 (2) After considering the recommendations of the [Advisory Council on
19 Libraries] **STATE LIBRARIAN**, establish library policies and procedures for the statewide
20 system of libraries;

21 (3) Consider the library needs of this State and recommend to the Governor
22 and the General Assembly desirable legislation; and

23 (4) With the approval of the Governor, accept, administer, and spend any
24 appropriation, gift, or grant for library purposes from the federal government or from any
25 other person.

26 **[(c)] (D)** In accordance with the bylaws, rules, and regulations of the State Board
27 **OF EDUCATION**, the State Superintendent shall certificate professional library personnel.

28 **[(d)] (E)** Each year the State **LIBRARY** Board shall report to the Governor and
29 the people of this State on the support, condition, progress, and needs of libraries.

1 ~~[(e)] (F)~~ The State **LIBRARY** Board shall approve county public library capital
2 projects for State funding in accordance with ~~[\S 23-510]~~ **\S 23-509** of this title.

4 (a) In addition to any other powers granted and duties imposed by this title, and
5 subject to the authority of the State **LIBRARY** Board, the ~~[Division of Library Development~~
6 ~~and Services]~~ **STATE LIBRARY AGENCY** has the powers and duties set forth in this
7 section.

8 (b) The ~~[Division of Library Development and Services]~~ **STATE LIBRARY**
9 **AGENCY** shall:

10 (1) Provide leadership and guidance for the planning and coordinated
11 development of library and information service in this State;

12 (2) Develop statewide public and school library services and networks,
13 resource centers, and other arrangements to meet the library and information needs of this
14 State;

15 (3) Provide professional and technical advice on improving library services
16 in this State to:

17 (i) Public and school library officials;

18 **(II) HIGHER EDUCATION AND SPECIAL LIBRARY OFFICIALS;**

19 ~~[(ii)] (III)~~ State government agencies; and

20 ~~[(iii)] (IV)~~ Any other person;

21 (4) (i) Collect library statistics and other data;

22 (ii) Identify library needs and provide for needed research and
23 studies of them;

24 (iii) Publish and distribute findings in these areas; and

25 (iv) Coordinate library services with other information and education
26 services and agencies;

27 (5) Administer federal and State funds appropriated to it by the State for
28 library purposes;

29 (6) (i) Develop and recommend professional standards and policies for
30 libraries; and

1 (ii) Establish requirements and procedures for the certification of
2 librarians and library personnel;

3 (7) Provide:

4 (i) Specialized library service to the blind and other physically
5 handicapped individuals in this State; and

6 (ii) Other desirable specialized library services;

7 (8) Encourage, advise, and assist in establishing, operating, and
8 coordinating libraries at State institutions and agencies and administer the operation of
9 library and information services for the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**;

10 (9) Administer the State grant program for county public library capital
11 projects, in accordance with [§ 23–510] **§ 23–509** of this title;

12 (10) Adopt guidelines for the administration of public libraries and
13 recommend to the State **LIBRARY** Board rules and regulations to implement this title;

14 (11) Cooperate with national library agencies and those of any other state;

15 (12) Develop a Deaf Culture Digital Library in accordance with [§ 23–108]
16 **§ 23–109** of this title; and

17 (13) Perform any other duty necessary for its proper operation.

18 **[23–106.] 23–107.**

19 (a) There is a Maryland [Advisory Council on Libraries] **STATE LIBRARY**
20 **BOARD**.

21 (b) (1) The [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** consists of 12
22 members, 7 of whom are appointed by the Governor. Each member is entitled to participate
23 fully and equally in the activities of the [Council] **BOARD**.

24 (2) Each member shall:

25 (i) Be a resident of this State;

26 (ii) Be an individual of ability and integrity who is experienced in
27 public or library affairs; and

28 (iii) Represent the interests of the citizens of this State in better
29 library services.

1 (3) **(I)** Of the appointed members:

2 ~~(i)~~ **1.** Five shall be selected from the public at large;

3 ~~(ii)~~ **2.** One shall be a professional librarian; and

4 ~~(iii)~~ **3.** One shall be a library trustee.

5 **(II) THE GOVERNOR SHALL ENSURE GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY**
6 **WHEN APPOINTING MEMBERS.**

7 (4) The following officials serve ex officio and each may designate someone
8 to serve in his place:

9 (i) The Secretary of Higher Education;

10 (ii) The President of the Board of Trustees of Enoch Pratt Free
11 Library;

12 (iii) The President of the Maryland Library Association;

13 (iv) The Dean of the University of Maryland College of Library and
14 Information Services; and

15 (v) The President of the Maryland [Educational Media
16 Organization] **ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOL LIBRARIANS.**

17 (5) (i) Each appointed member serves for a term of 5 years and until a
18 successor is appointed and qualifies. These terms are staggered as required by the terms of
19 the members serving on July 1, 1978.

20 (ii) An appointed member may not serve more than two consecutive
21 terms.

22 (iii) A member appointed to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term serves
23 only for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

24 (6) Each member of the [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD:**

25 (i) Serves without compensation; and

26 (ii) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses in accordance with the
27 Standard State Travel Regulations.

28 (c) (1) Each year:

1 (i) The Governor shall appoint a member of the [Advisory Council]
2 **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** as its Chairman; and

3 (ii) The [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** shall elect one
4 of its members as its vice chairman.

5 (2) The [Assistant Superintendent for Libraries] **STATE LIBRARIAN**
6 shall:

7 (i) Serve as secretary to the [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY**
8 **BOARD**;

9 (ii) Record the proceedings of the [Council] **STATE LIBRARY**
10 **BOARD**; and

11 (iii) Provide necessary staff services.

12 (3) [The Advisory Council shall meet at least once a year at the times and
13 places its Chairman designates] **EACH YEAR, THE STATE LIBRARY BOARD:**

14 **(I) SHALL HOLD AT LEAST FOUR REGULAR MEETINGS; AND**

15 **(II) MAY HOLD SPECIAL MEETINGS AS NECESSARY.**

16 (4) Seven members of the [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** are
17 a quorum and at least 7 affirmative votes are required for any recommendation to:

18 (i) The [Division of Library Services] **STATE LIBRARY AGENCY**;

19 [(ii) The State Superintendent;

20 (iii) The State Board;] or

21 [(iv)] **(II)** The Governor.

22 (d) The [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** shall:

23 (1) Gather information on the needs of libraries throughout this State;

24 (2) [Advise the Division of Library Development and Services, the State
25 Superintendent, the State Board, and] **OVERSEE THE STATE LIBRARY AGENCY**;

26 **(3) ADVISE** the Governor on library matters; and

1 ~~(3)~~ (4) Promote improvement of library services in this State.

2 (e) The [Advisory Council] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** may be funded annually as
3 provided in the budget of the [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE**
4 **LIBRARY AGENCY**.

5 ~~[23–107.] 23–108.~~

6 (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, a free association,
7 school, college or university library in this State shall prohibit inspection, use, or disclosure
8 of any circulation record or other item, collection, or grouping of information about an
9 individual that:

10 (1) Is maintained by a library;

11 (2) Contains an individual's name or the identifying number, symbol, or
12 other identifying particular assigned to the individual; and

13 (3) Identifies the use a patron makes of that library's materials, services,
14 or facilities.

15 (b) A free association, school, college, or university library in the State shall
16 permit inspection, use, or disclosure of the circulation record of an individual only in
17 connection with the library's ordinary business and only for the purposes for which the
18 record was created.

20 (a) The [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE LIBRARY**
21 **AGENCY** shall establish the Deaf Culture Digital Library as the primary information
22 center on deaf resources for library customers and staff in the State.

23 (b) The Deaf Culture Digital Library shall:

24 (1) Conduct a needs assessment to identify gaps in library services for deaf
25 patrons and to implement strategies to fill the gaps and better coordinate library services
26 for the deaf;

27 (2) In coordination with the Governor's Office of Deaf and Hard of Hearing,
28 develop and provide sensitivity training for State and county library staff to help them
29 better understand deaf patrons and their needs;

30 (3) Develop a Web site that will allow for information sharing and
31 coordination between the Deaf Culture Digital Library and county library systems;

1 (4) In coordination with the [Division of Library Development and
2 Services] **STATE LIBRARY AGENCY**, develop deaf-related programs and materials and
3 share them with county library systems and other libraries in the State;

4 (5) Develop partnerships and strategic alliances with other entities,
5 including:

6 (i) The Governor's Office for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing;

7 (ii) County library systems;

8 (iii) The [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE**
9 **LIBRARY AGENCY**;

10 (iv) Veterans' groups;

11 (v) State and local arts councils;

12 (vi) Senior citizens organizations; and

13 (vii) Deaf and hard of hearing organizations, including:

14 1. The National Association of the Deaf;

15 2. The Hearing Loss Association of America; and

16 3. The Maryland Association of the Deaf;

17 (6) Encourage partnerships and collaborations with information service
18 providers to help provide virtual access to information and research;

19 (7) Form a Deaf Culture Digital Library Advisory Board to provide advice
20 on initiatives that further advance the mission and goals of the Deaf Culture Digital
21 Library and the majority of whose members are deaf or hard of hearing and selected from
22 the following entities:

23 (i) County library systems;

24 (ii) The [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE**
25 **LIBRARY AGENCY**;

26 (iii) The Governor's Office for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing;

27 (iv) Statewide deaf and hard of hearing organizations; and

1 (v) Other organizations as agreed on by the Governor's Office for the
2 Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the [Division of Library Development and Services] **STATE**
3 **LIBRARY AGENCY**; and

4 (8) Establish a Deaf Culture Digital Library "Friends of the Library" group
5 composed of individuals who are strongly committed, well-positioned, and able to promote
6 community involvement, advocacy, and funding for the Deaf Culture Digital Library.

7 (c) The lead employee or coordinator who manages the Deaf Culture Digital
8 Library shall be:

9 (1) A deaf or hard of hearing individual; and

10 (2) Knowledgeable and experienced concerning issues affecting deaf and
11 hard of hearing individuals.

12 23-201.

13 (a) The Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System is the State
14 Library Resource Center.

15 (b) The State Library Resource Center shall provide and expand access to
16 specialized library materials and services that are necessary for coordinated, efficient, and
17 economical library services in this State.

18 23-202.

19 (a) The boards of library trustees of at least three public library systems outside
20 the standard metropolitan statistical areas defined by the United States Bureau of the
21 Census may request the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** to establish and maintain
22 a regional resource center.

23 (b) Each regional resource center shall provide, through mutual cooperation and
24 coordination, books, information, and other material and service resources that an
25 individual library cannot provide adequately by itself.

26 (c) (1) A region to be served by a regional resource center shall have a
27 population of at least 100,000.

28 (2) Subject to approval by the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**, the
29 boards of library trustees of the participating library systems shall designate the library to
30 serve as the resource center.

31 (3) If possible, the library selected as the regional resource center shall be:

32 (i) The strongest library in the region; and

1 (ii) Located so as to be of greatest service to the entire region.

2 (d) (1) There is a board of advisors for each regional resource center.

3 (2) The board of advisors consists of two individuals selected by the board
4 of trustees of each participating library system to represent its library.

5 (3) The board of advisors for each regional resource center shall:

6 (i) Gather information on the resource needs of its region and this
7 State;

8 (ii) Before State funds are distributed to it, make an annual report
9 to the [Department and the State Advisory Council on Libraries] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**
10 that evaluates and makes recommendations on the operation of the center;

11 (iii) Recommend to the board of trustees of the library designated as
12 the regional resource center and to the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** policies
13 and procedures for the development and use of the regional resource center;

14 (iv) Promote the use of the regional resource center;

15 (v) Recommend the purchase, condemnation, rental, use, sale, or
16 conveyance of property for any purpose valid under this section; and

17 (vi) Recommend plans for the regional resource centers, which may
18 include the use of facilities of participating libraries, additions to the facilities of
19 participating libraries, or new facilities separate from the existing facilities of participating
20 libraries.

21 (e) (1) The head of each regional resource center is the administrator of the
22 library designated as the center.

23 (2) The administrator shall operate the regional resource center under
24 standards adopted by the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**.

25 (3) The policies and procedures of the regional resource center shall be:

26 (i) Recommended by the board of trustees of the library designated
27 as the center; and

28 (ii) Approved by the board of advisors of the center.

29 (f) Each regional resource center shall:

- 1 (1) Make interlibrary loans of books and materials;
- 2 (2) Supply collections and exhibits of specialized materials;
- 3 (3) Provide consultant services;
- 4 (4) Organize inservice training for library staffs; and
- 5 (5) Develop and operate cooperative services among libraries.

6 23–203.

7 (a) The board of library trustees of any public library system that is not
8 participating in a regional resource center may participate in a metropolitan cooperative
9 service program.

10 (b) Each metropolitan cooperative service program shall conform to standards
11 adopted by the State **LIBRARY** Board.

12 (c) Each metropolitan cooperative service program shall make an annual report
13 of its operations to the [Department and the State Advisory Council on Libraries] **STATE**
14 **LIBRARY BOARD**.

15 23–204.

16 The [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** periodically shall evaluate the
17 effectiveness of the services performed by each regional resource center and metropolitan
18 cooperative service program and may request any reports and information necessary for
19 this purpose.

20 23–205.

21 (a) Each year, the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** may include in its
22 budget operating funds for:

- 23 (1) The State Library Resource Center;
- 24 (2) Each regional resource center;
- 25 (3) The Maryland Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped;
- 26 (4) **THE DEAF CULTURE DIGITAL LIBRARY**; and
- 27 [(4)] (5) Each metropolitan cooperative service program.

28 (b) (1) The State shall pay all capital expenses for:

1 (i) The State Library Resource Center; and

2 (ii) Each regional resource center.

3 (2) Before any money is spent under this subsection, the appropriate board
4 of library trustees shall:

5 (i) Have the project approved by the [Department] **STATE**
6 **LIBRARY BOARD**;

7 (ii) Through the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**, submit
8 the request to the Department of Budget and Management for consideration under Title 3,
9 Subtitle 6 of the State Finance and Procurement Article; and

10 (iii) Agree to reimburse the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD**
11 an amount the [Department] **STATE LIBRARY BOARD** determines if the facility ceases to
12 be used for a resource center or cooperative service program.

13 (c) (1) Each year each participating regional resource center shall receive a
14 minimum amount of funding for each resident of the area served, to be used for operating
15 and capital expenses.

16 (2) The allocation shall be calculated as follows:

17 (i) For each of fiscal years 2011 through 2015.....\$6.75 per each
18 resident of the area served;

19 (ii) For fiscal year 2016..... \$6.95 per each resident of the area
20 served;

21 (iii) For fiscal year 2017..... \$7.15 per each resident of the area

24 shall be transferred without diminution of their rights, benefits, employment, or retirement
25 status.

26 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as expressly provided
27 to the contrary in this Act, any transaction affected by or flowing from any statute added,
28 amended, repealed, or transferred under this Act and validly entered into before the
29 effective date of this Act, and every right, duty, or interest flowing from it remains valid
30 after the effective date of this Act and may be terminated, completed, consummated, or
31 enforced under the law.

32 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise provided
33 by law, all existing laws, regulations, proposed regulations, standards and guidelines,
34 policies, orders and other directives, forms, plans, memberships, contracts, property,
35 investigations, administrative and judicial responsibilities, rights to sue and be sued, and
36 all other duties and responsibilities associated with the functions of the agencies and units
37 that are the subject of this Act prior to the effective date of this Act shall continue in effect
38 under and, as appropriate, are legal and binding on the State Library Agency and the State

1 Library Board until completed, withdrawn, canceled, modified, or otherwise changed under
2 the law.

3 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Library Board shall
4 be the successor to the Maryland Advisory Council on Libraries and nothing in this Act
5 shall affect the terms of office of a member of the Maryland Advisory Council on Libraries
6 who is serving on the effective date of this Act. An individual who is a member of any such
7 entity on the effective date of this Act shall remain a member for the balance of the term to
8 which the member is appointed, unless the member sooner dies, resigns, or is removed
9 under appropriate provisions of law.

10 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the
11 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
12 Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the
13 General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act or by
14 any other Act of the General Assembly of 2017 that affects provisions enacted by this Act.
15 The publisher shall adequately describe any such correction in an editor’s note following
16 the section affected.

17 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if any provision of this Act or
18 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a
19 court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other
20 application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application,
21 and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

22 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 July 1, 2017.
