A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Education – Prekindergarten Programs – Online Registration

- FOR the purpose of requiring certain county boards of education to allow certain parents
 and guardians to register their child for certain prekindergarten programs in person
 or online; and generally relating to registration for publicly funded prekindergarten
 programs in the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Education

- $15 \quad 7-101.1.$
- 16 (a) (1) In this section the following terms have the meanings indicated.

17 (2) "Economically disadvantaged background" means a family whose 18 income would make a child eligible for free or reduced price meals if the child were in 19 kindergarten.

- 20 (3) "Eligible child" means a child:
- 21 (i) Who is from an economically disadvantaged background;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

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1 (ii) Whose parent or guardian seeks to enroll the child in a public 2 prekindergarten program; and

3 (iii) Who is 4 years old on September 1 of the school year in which the 4 parent or legal guardian seeks to enroll the child in a public prekindergarten program.

5 (4) "Eligible for free or reduced price meals" means eligible for free or 6 reduced price meals based on eligibility requirements established by the United States 7 Department of Agriculture.

8 (b) By the 2007–2008 school year, all eligible children shall be admitted free of 9 charge to publicly funded prekindergarten programs established by each of the county 10 boards.

(C) A COUNTY BOARD SHALL ALLOW A PARENT OR GUARDIAN TO REGISTER THEIR CHILD IN A PUBLICLY FUNDED PREKINDERGARTEN PROGRAM IN PERSON OR ONLINE.

14 **[**(c)**] (D)** (1) A local department of social services or a local health department 15 shall provide a parent or guardian with an oral and written notice that their child may be 16 eligible for publicly funded prekindergarten programs if the parent or guardian:

(i) Applied for economic services with the local department of socialservices or the local health department; and

19 (ii) Has a child who will be 4 years old on September 1 of the next20 academic year.

(2) The notice required under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall include
 contact information for the enrollment office of the local school system and the Division of
 Early Childhood Development in the Department.

(3) On or before December 1 of each year, each local department of social
services and each local health department shall report to the General Assembly, in
accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on the number of parents who
were given a notification and subsequently enrolled their child in a publicly funded
prekindergarten program.

29 [(d)] (E) The requirements set forth in § 7–101(b) of this subtitle regarding the 30 domicile of a child and the residency of the child's parent or guardian shall apply to 31 prekindergarten programs established by county boards as required by this section.

32 [(e)] (F) In the comprehensive master plan that is submitted under § 5–401 of 33 this article, a county board shall identify the strategies that will be used in that county to 34 ensure that publicly funded prekindergarten programs are available to all eligible children 35 in that county by the 2007–2008 school year.

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1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 2 1, 2017.
