FOR the purpose of exempting certain students from the requirement to be assessed using certain cut scores to make certain determinations under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain county boards of education from requiring certain students to take a certain assessment to meet a certain requirement; and generally relating to the college and career readiness assessment as it relates to English learner students.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

17 7-205.1.

18 (a) The State Board shall establish high school curriculum and graduation 19 requirements for all public schools in accordance with this section.

20 (b) (1) (I) [Beginning with the 2015–2016 school year,] SUBJECT TO 21 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, all students shall be assessed using 22 acceptable college placement cut scores no later than 11th grade to determine whether the



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student is ready for college-level credit-bearing course work in English Language Arts,
 Literacy, and Mathematics.

(II) FOR A STUDENT WHO IS AN ENGLISH LEARNER REQUIRED
TO DEMONSTRATE THE STUDENT'S ENGLISH PROFICIENCY BY TAKING THE
STATE-APPROVED ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY ASSESSMENT, A COUNTY
BOARD MAY NOT REQUIRE THE STUDENT TO TAKE AN ASSESSMENT THAT IS NOT
OFFERED FREE OF CHARGE IN ORDER TO MEET THE REQUIREMENT UNDER
SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.

9 (2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Department, 10 in collaboration with local school systems and public community colleges, shall develop and 11 implement, by the 2016–2017 school year, transition courses or other instructional 12 opportunities to be delivered in the 12th grade to students who have not achieved college 13 and career readiness by the end of the 11th grade.

- (ii) The implementation of transition courses or other instructionalopportunities required under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph:
- 16 1. Shall include an assessment or reassessment of the 17 student after completion of the course; and
- 18 2. May not preclude or replace enrollment in a course 19 otherwise required for graduation from high school.
- (c) (1) Beginning with the 9th grade class of 2014, and subject to paragraph
 (2) of this subsection and subsection (e) of this section, each student shall enroll in a
 mathematics course in each year of high school that the student attends high school.
- (2) The Department shall adopt regulations that establish the
 mathematics and math-related courses that fulfill the requirements of this subsection,
 which may include math-related career and technology program courses.
- 26 (d) It is the goal of the State that all students achieve mathematics competency 27 in Algebra II.
- 28 (e) A student who is enrolled in a credit-bearing mathematics transition course 29 under subsection (b)(2) of this section:
- 30 (1) Subject to item (2) of this subsection, shall be considered to meet the 31 requirements of subsection (c) of this section; and
- 32 (2) May not be considered to meet the requirements of subsection (c) of this 33 section if other credit-bearing courses required for graduation have not been met.
