- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Insurance
- 16 **15–850.**
- 17 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "OPIOID ANTAGONIST" MEANS:
- 18 (1) NALOXONE HYDROCHLORIDE; OR
- 19 (2) ANY OTHER SIMILARLY ACTING AND EQUALLY SAFE DRUG
- 20 APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION FOR THE
- 21 TREATMENT OF A DRUG OVERDOSE.
- 22 (B) (1) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO:

1	(I) INSURERS AND NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLANS THAT
2	PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS UNDER INDIVIDUAL, GROUP, OR
3	BLANKET HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES OR CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR
4	DELIVERED IN THE STATE: AND

- 5 (II) HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE 6 COVERAGE FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS UNDER GROUP CONTRACTS THAT ARE 7 ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE.
- 8 (2) AN INSURER, A NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLAN, OR A HEALTH
 9 MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR PRESCRIPTION
 10 DRUGS THROUGH A PHARMACY BENEFITS MANAGER IS SUBJECT TO THE
 11 REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
- 12 (C) AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION THAT INCLUDES ON ITS 13 FORMULARY AN OPIOID ANTAGONIST MAY NOT APPLY A PRIOR AUTHORIZATION 14 REQUIREMENT FOR THE OPIOID ANTAGONIST.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all policies, contracts, and health benefit plans issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or after January 1, 2018.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2018.
