A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Dyslexia Education Pilot Program Advisory Board

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Dyslexia Education Pilot Program Advisory Board in 4 the State Department of Education; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing 5 of the Advisory Board; prohibiting a member of the Advisory Board from receiving 6 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 requiring the Advisory Board, in consultation with the Department, to identify a 8 principal investigator for the Program; requiring the Advisory Board, in consultation 9 with the Department, to develop a certain Request for Proposals, select certain partners for the Program, and establish a Pilot Program Implementation Team; 10 11 requiring the Advisory Board, in consultation with certain entities, to establish a 12 process to select local school systems to participate in the Program and establish a 13 Local Education Agency Team; requiring the Advisory Board, in consultation with a 14 Principal Investigator and the Pilot Program Implementation Team, to implement 15 the Program for a certain period of time; requiring the Advisory Board to report its 16 progress to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date each 17 year; defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 18 relating to the Dyslexia Education Pilot Program Advisory Board.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and, at the end of June 30, 2024, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
