## A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 Education – Student Achievement Gap Standard – Establishment 3 (Maryland Student Achievement Act)

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, on or before a certain  $\mathbf{5}$ date, to establish a standard to measure and quantify the student achievement gap, 6 identify certain achievement gaps between certain student groups, and issue best 7 practices and annual benchmarks to close the student achievement gap between 8 certain groups over a certain time period; requiring a certain standard to include 9 certain criteria; requiring certain local school systems, beginning on or before a certain date, to document the student achievement gap in the district for a certain 10 11 time period using a certain standard and develop a certain strategic plan to close the 12student achievement gap; requiring a certain strategic plan to include certain costs; 13 requiring certain local school systems to conduct a certain number of public meetings 14 in developing a certain strategic plan; and generally relating to the establishment of a student achievement gap standard. 15

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
  That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 25 (A) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2018, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:

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1 (1) ESTABLISH A STANDARD TO MEASURE AND QUANTIFY THE 2 STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAP;

3 (2) IDENTIFY THE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAPS THAT EXIST 4 BETWEEN:

- 5 (I) RACIAL GROUPS;
- 6 (II) ETHNIC GROUPS;
- 7 (III) SOCIOECONOMIC GROUPS;
- 8 (IV) GENDERS; AND

9 (V) ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS AND STUDENTS WHOSE 10 PRIMARY LANGUAGE IS ENGLISH; AND

11 (3) ISSUE BEST PRACTICES AND ANNUAL BENCHMARKS TO CLOSE 12 THE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAP BETWEEN THE GROUPS LISTED IN ITEM (2) OF 13 THIS SUBSECTION OVER A 5-YEAR PERIOD.

14 **(B)** THE STANDARD ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION **(A)(1)** OF THIS 15 SECTION SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

16 (1) READING AND MATHEMATICS SCORES OF THE PARTNERSHIP FOR 17 ASSESSMENT OF READINESS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS (PARCC) 18 ASSESSMENTS;

- 19 (2) HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES; AND
- 20 (3) NINTH GRADE DROPOUT RATES.
- 21 (C) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2019, EACH LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL:

(1) DOCUMENT THE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAP WITHIN THE
 DISTRICT FOR THE PREVIOUS 20 YEARS USING THE STANDARD ESTABLISHED BY THE
 DEPARTMENT IN SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION; AND

25(2)DEVELOP A 5-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN FOR SCHOOL YEARS 202026THROUGH 2025 TO CLOSE THE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAP IN THE DISTRICT.

1 (D) (1) THE 5-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION 2 (C)(2) OF THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE PER PUPIL COSTS TO IMPLEMENT THE 3 RECOMMENDATIONS IN THE STRATEGIC PLAN.

4 (2) IN DEVELOPING THE 5-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN, THE LOCAL 5 SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL CONDUCT THREE PUBLIC MEETINGS IN THE DISTRICT.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 7 1, 2017.
