(iii) 2 (2) This section does not affect the authority of a county, a municipality, or 3 any other local government to enact and enforce recycling requirements, including establishing civil penalties, for a special event that are more stringent than the 4 5 requirements of this section. 6 (b) **(1)** BEFORE ISSUING A PERMIT FOR A SPECIAL EVENT, A COUNTY, A 7 MUNICIPALITY, OR ANY OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENT SHALL PROVIDE TO THE 8 ORGANIZER OF THE SPECIAL EVENT A WRITTEN STATEMENT THAT DESCRIBES THE 9 REQUIREMENTS AND PENALTIES UNDER THIS SECTION. 10 [(1)] **(2)** In addition to any other conditions required as part of a special events or other permit, the organizer of a special event shall: 11 12 Provide a recycling receptacle immediately adjacent to each 13 trash receptacle at the special event; 14 Ensure that all recycling receptacles are clearly distinguished 15 from trash receptacles by color or signage; and 16 Ensure that all recyclable materials deposited into recycling (iii) 17 receptacles at the special event are collected for recycling. A county may require the organizer of a special event that 18 **[**(2)**] (3)** provides for recycling to report to the county on recycling activities in a manner determined 19 20 by the county. 21The recycling required under subsection (b) of this section shall be carried out in accordance with the recycling plan required under § 9–1703 of this subtitle for the county 2223 in which the special event takes place. 24A person OR AN ORGANIZATION that violates subsection (b) or (c) of this 25section is subject to a civil penalty [not exceeding \$50 for each day on which the violation 26 exists OF: 27 **(1)** FOR EVENTS THAT HAVE 100 TO 499 PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE, \$500: 28 29 **(2)** FOR EVENTS THAT HAVE 500 TO 999 PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE, \$1,000; 30

- 5 (e) (1) A COUNTY, A MUNICIPALITY, OR ANY OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENT 6 THAT ISSUES A SPECIAL EVENTS OR OTHER PERMIT AUTHORIZING A SPECIAL EVENT 7 SHALL ENFORCE THIS SECTION.
- 8 **(2)** An enforcement unit, officer, or official of a county, a municipality, or 9 any other local government may conduct inspections of a special event location to enforce 10 [subsection (b) of] this section.
- 11 (f) Any penalties collected under subsection (d) of this section shall be paid to the county, municipality, or other local government that brought the enforcement action.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
