WHEREAS, Tens of thousands of Marylanders do not have any options for wired 1 2 broadband service: and 3 WHEREAS, In the twenty-first century, all homes and businesses in the State 4 require wired broadband service to connect to the global community; and 5 WHEREAS, The existing copper lines that enable DSL to operate have been 6 abandoned through lack of maintenance and neglect; and 7 WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the State to ensure that every home and 8 business in the State has access to at least one wired broadband option; now, therefore, 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 11 Article - Economic Development 12 5-1102.13 There is a Rural Broadband Assistance Fund in the Department. (a) The purpose of the Fund is to assist in the establishment of broadband 14 (b) 15 communication services in rural and underserved areas of the State. 16 (c) The Department shall administer the Fund. 17 (d) (1) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to reversion 18 under § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. 19 (2)The Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the Comptroller 20 shall account for the Fund. The Fund consists of: 21(e) 22(1) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; 23money appropriated in the State budget to the Maryland Economic (2)24Development Assistance Fund under Subtitle 3 of this title for the purpose of assisting in the establishment of broadband communication services in rural and underserved areas of 2526 the State; 27 (3) federal money allocated or granted to the Fund; [and]

2 3 4	(f) The Fund may be used only for planning, construction, and maintenance of broadband communication services and equipment in rural and underserved areas and related activities.
5 6	(g) (1) The Treasurer shall invest the money in the Fund in the same manner as other State money may be invested.
7 8	(2) Any investment earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the General Fund of the State.
9 10	(h) The Department shall make payments from the Fund within 30 days after notice of a decision of the Board under § 13–504(3) of this article.

- 6 A SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH A THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR; OR
- 7 (3) PAY THE COST OF PROVIDING WIRED BROADBAND SERVICE TO
- 8 THE RURAL BROADBAND ASSISTANCE FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 5–1102 OF THE
- 9 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ARTICLE.

- 11 (A) TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED UNDER FEDERAL LAW, THE COMMISSION 12 SHALL COOPERATE WITH THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION ON
- 13 EFFORTS TO PROMOTE UNIVERSAL WIRED BROADBAND ACCESS IN THE STATE.
- 14 (B) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31 EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL
