4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Natural Resources**

4 4–803.

5 (a) The Department may adopt rules and regulations to effectuate the following
6 purposes:

7 (1) To restrict catching and possessing any blue crab;

8 (2) The methods by which crabs are taken;

9 (3) To close or open any specified area to catch crabs;

10 (4) To prohibit or restrict devices used to catch crabs;

11 (5) To establish seasons to catch crabs;

12 (6) To establish that the workday for tidal fish licensees who catch crabs
13 using trotline gear may begin earlier than 1 hour before sunrise; and

14 (7) To establish minimum size limits for hard, soft, and peeler crabs.
15 However, this section does not permit the Department to change existing license fees for
16 catching, picking, canning, packing, or shipping cooked hard or soft crabs or crab meat; or
17 for selling, or shipping live hard or soft crabs by barrel or crate. The Department may set
18 license fees on types of gear or equipment if not otherwise set by law.

19 (b) (1) The Department may not adopt regulations to:

20 (i) Restrict a tidal fish licensee who catches crabs using trotline gear
21 to a workday of less than 8 hours per day, excluding time spent setting or taking up gear;
22 or

23 (ii) Establish time restrictions on a tidal fish licensee using trotline
24 gear for setting and taking up gear.

25 (2) ~~IF EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, IF~~
26 the Department authorizes the workday to begin earlier than 1 hour before sunrise, then:

27 (i) ~~{The} SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE~~
28 Department may not adopt regulations to restrict a tidal fish licensee who catches crabs
29 using trotline gear to a workday of less than 11 hours per day, including time spent setting
30 or taking up gear; and

1 (ii) Trotline gear may not be set earlier than the catch time
2 established by the Department.

3 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ~~ALLOW PROVIDE~~
4 ~~AUTHORIZE~~ A TIDAL FISH LICENSEE WHO IS AUTHORIZED TO CATCH CRABS USING
5 ~~TROT LINES OR CRAB POTS~~ ALL LEGAL GEAR TO WORK ~~THE FOLLOWING HOURS~~ 1
6 ~~ADDITIONAL EARLY HOUR~~ ON LABOR DAY, MEMORIAL DAY, INDEPENDENCE DAY
7 JULY 4, LABOR DAY, AND THE ~~WEEKEND EITHER~~ DAY BEFORE ~~OR AFTER~~ EACH OF
8 THESE HOLIDAYS IN A LICENSE YEAR:

9 (1) ~~FOR A LICENSEE WHO USES TROTLINE GEAR, HOURS THAT BEGIN~~
10 ~~2 HOURS BEFORE SUNRISE AND END 8 HOURS AFTER SUNRISE, NOT INCLUDING TIME~~
11 ~~SPENT SETTING OR TAKING UP GEAR, OR~~

12 (2) ~~FOR A LICENSEE WHO USES CRAB POTS, HOURS THAT BEGIN 1.5~~
13 ~~HOURS BEFORE SUNRISE AND END 6.5 HOURS AFTER SUNRISE.~~

14 [(c)] (D) The Department's regulations may not become effective under this
15 section until the Department first holds public hearings. The Department shall advertise
16 the time, place, and purpose of the hearings in one newspaper of general daily circulation
17 in the State, and at least in one newspaper circulated in the affected region of each county
18 whose waters may be directly affected by the proposed regulations at least once per week
19 for 2 successive weeks in advance of the hearings.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~June~~
21 July 1, 2017.
