- 10 (ii) The limitation on noneconomic damages provided under 11 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall increase by \$15,000 on January 1 of each year 12 beginning January 1, 2009. The increased amount shall apply to causes of action arising 13 between January 1 and December 31 of that year, inclusive.
- 14 (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the 15 limitation under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall apply in the aggregate to all claims 16 for personal injury and wrongful death arising from the same medical injury, regardless of 17 the number of claims, claimants, plaintiffs, beneficiaries, or defendants.
- 18 (ii) If there is a wrongful death action in which there are two or more 19 claimants or beneficiaries, whether or not there is a personal injury action arising from the 20 same medical injury, the total amount awarded for noneconomic damages for all actions 21 may not exceed 125% of the limitation established under paragraph (1) of this subsection, 22 regardless of the number of claims, claimants, plaintiffs, beneficiaries, or defendants.

- 24 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 25 (2) (i) "Noneconomic damages" means:
- 26 1. In an action for personal injury, pain, suffering, 27 inconvenience, physical impairment, disfigurement, loss of consortium, or other 28 nonpecuniary injury; and
- 2. In an action for wrongful death, mental anguish, emotional pain and suffering, loss of society, companionship, comfort, protection, care, marital care, parental care, filial care, attention, advice, counsel, training, guidance, or education, or other noneconomic damages authorized under Title 3, Subtitle 9 of this article.
 - (ii) "Noneconomic damages" does not include punitive damages.

- 1 (3) "Primary claimant" means a claimant in an action for the death of a person described under § 3–904(d) of this article.
- 3 (4) "Secondary claimant" means a claimant in an action for the death of a 4 person described under § 3–904(e) of this article.
- 5 (b) (1) In any action for damages for personal injury in which the cause of action arises on or after July 1, 1986, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed 7 \$350,000.
- 8 (2) (i) Except as provided in paragraph (3)(ii) of this subsection, in any action for damages for personal injury or wrongful death in which the cause of action arises on or after October 1, 1994, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed \$500,000.
- 11 (ii) The limitation on noneconomic damages provided under 12 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall increase by \$15,000 on October 1 of each year 13 beginning on October 1, 1995. The increased amount shall apply to causes of action arising 14 between October 1 of that year and September 30 of the following year, inclusive.
- 15 (3) (i) The limitation established under paragraph (2) of this subsection 16 shall apply in a personal injury action to each direct victim of tortious conduct and all 17 persons who claim injury by or through that victim.
- (ii) In a wrongful death action in which there are two or more claimants or beneficiaries, an award for noneconomic damages may not exceed [150%] 450% of the limitation established under paragraph (2) of this subsection, regardless of the number of claimants or beneficiaries who share in the award.
- 22 (c) An award by the health claims arbitration panel in accordance with § 3–2A–05 of this article for damages in which the cause of action arose before January 1, 24 2005, shall be considered an award for purposes of this section.
- 25 (d) (1) In a jury trial, the jury may [not] be informed of the limitation 26 established under subsection (b) of this section.
- 27 (2) (i) If the jury awards an amount for noneconomic damages that 28 exceeds the limitation established under subsection (b) of this section, the court shall 29 reduce the amount to conform to the limitation.
- 30 (ii) In a wrongful death action in which there are two or more 31 claimants or beneficiaries, if the jury awards an amount for noneconomic damages that 32 exceeds the limitation established under subsection (b)(3)(ii) of this section, the court shall:
