1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Personnel – Disabled Veterans – Noncompetitive Appointment

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing an appointing authority to select certain disabled veterans 4 for certain positions in the State Personnel Management System using a certain $\mathbf{5}$ selection process; requiring an appointing authority for a certain position in a unit 6 in the Executive Branch of State government with an independent personnel system 7 to develop a certain selection process for certain disabled veterans; providing that 8 certain provisions of law relating to appointments to certain positions in the State 9 Personnel Management System do not apply to the selection of certain disabled 10 veterans under certain provisions of this Act; requiring a certain appointing 11 authority to interview certain disabled veterans under certain circumstances; 12providing that an appointing authority is not required to interview certain 13 applicants under certain circumstances; providing for the effect of certain provisions 14 of this Act; making a conforming change; and generally relating to the appointment 15of disabled veterans to positions in State government.

10 **(5)** THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT REQUIRE AN APPOINTING 11 AUTHORITY TO SELECT A DISABLED VETERAN FOR A VACANT POSITION OR PROHIBIT 12 AN APPOINTING AUTHORITY FROM FILLING A VACANT POSITION IN ACCORDANCE 13 WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2017.
