- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that for a first offense for selling or providing alcoholic beverages to an individual under the age of 21 years, a license holder or an employee 4 of the license holder is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a certain fine: 5 6 providing that for each subsequent offense, a license holder or an employee of the 7 license holder who violates a certain provision of law is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a certain fine; in Washington County a violation of the prohibition 8 9 against selling or providing alcoholic beverages to an individual under the age of 21 10 years is a misdemeanor; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners to impose 11 certain penalties on an employee of a license holder or a license holder who violates the prohibition; authorizing the Board to suspend or revoke a license under certain 12 conditions; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Washington County. 13
