FOR the purpose of adopting the findings and conclusions contained in the Report by the
Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics issued on February 28, 2017; and ordering
the reprimand of Delegate Dan K. Morhaim by the House of Delegates of Maryland
pursuant to Article III, Section 19 of the Maryland Constitution.

8 WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics, pursuant to a complaint 9 issued by the Joint Committee on October 19, 2016, conducted a thorough review of the 10 allegation of violations of the Maryland Public Ethics Law by Delegate Dan K. Morhaim 11 relating to the use of his public office for personal gain or gain of another; and

WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics submitted detailed findings,
adopted by a unanimous vote of its members, in a Report dated February 28, 2017; and

14 WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics found that the improper 15 actions of Delegate Morhaim have brought disrepute and dishonor to the members of the 16 House of Delegates and the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics recommended in its Report, with all of its members concurring, that "[t]he Speaker of the House of Delegates submit to the House of Delegates, and the full House of Delegates adopt, a resolution of reprimand expressing the House of Delegates' disapproval of Delegate Morhaim's actions, based on his activities as set forth in this Report of the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That Delegate Dan K. Morhaim be reprimanded by the House of Delegates of Maryland, pursuant to Article III, Section 19 of the Maryland Constitution.
