19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND
20	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (a) On or before December 1, 2007, each law enforcement agency in the State shall 2 adopt written policies relating to eyewitness identification that comply with the United 3 States Department of Justice standards on obtaining accurate eyewitness identification.
- 4 (b) [On or before January 1, 2008, each law enforcement agency in the State shall 5 file a copy of the written policy relating to eyewitness identification with the Department 6 of State Police.
- 7 (c) (1) On or before February 1, 2008, the Department of State Police shall 8 compile the written policy relating to eyewitness identification of each law enforcement 9 agency in the State.
- 10 (2) The Department of State Police shall allow public inspection of each 11 policy compiled.
- 12 (d) (1)] On or before January 1, 2016, each law enforcement agency in the State 13 shall:
- 14 **[**(i) 1.**] (1)** adopt the Police Training Commission's Eyewitness 15 Identification Model Policy; or
- 16 [2.] (2) adopt and implement a written policy relating to identification procedures that complies with § 3–506.1 of this subtitle [; and
- 18 (ii) file a copy of the written policy with the Department of State 19 Police.
- 20 (2) On or before February 1, 2016, the Department of State Police shall compile the written policies relating to identification procedures of each law enforcement agency in the State.

- 26 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, each law enforcement 27 agency shall post all of the official policies of the law enforcement agency, including public 28 complaint procedures and collective bargaining agreements:
- 29 (1) on the Web site of the Maryland Police Training and Standards 30 Commission; and
- 31 (2) on the agency's own Web site, if the agency maintains a Web site.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2017.
