BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 3–506 Annotated Code of Maryland (2011 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 3–515(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2011 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 3 (a) On or before December 1, 2007, each law enforcement agency in the State shall 4 adopt written policies relating to eyewitness identification that comply with the United 5 States Department of Justice standards on obtaining accurate eyewitness identification.
- 6 (b) [On or before January 1, 2008, each law enforcement agency in the State shall 7 file a copy of the written policy relating to eyewitness identification with the Department 8 of State Police.
- 9 (c) (1) On or before February 1, 2008, the Department of State Police shall compile the written policy relating to eyewitness identification of each law enforcement agency in the State.
