### 1 AN ACT concerning

## Property Tax Credit – Disabled or Fallen Law Enforcement Officers and Rescue Workers – Acquisition of Dwelling <u>Alterations</u>

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City or the 4 governing body of a county or of a municipal corporation to grant a certain property  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 tax credit for certain residential real property owned by certain surviving spouses or 7 certain cohabitants of certain fallen law enforcement officers and rescue workers; increasing the number of years within which a disabled law enforcement officer or 8 9 rescue worker or the surviving spouse or certain cohabitants of a fallen law 10 enforcement officer or rescue worker must have acquired certain residential property 11 in order to qualify for a certain property tax credit against the county or municipal 12 corporation property tax imposed on the property; making conforming changes; 13providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to a property tax 14 credit for certain residential property in the State.

6 (b) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City or the governing body of a 7 county or municipal corporation may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this section 8 against the county or municipal corporation property tax imposed on a dwelling that is 9 owned by a disabled law enforcement officer or rescue worker, a surviving spouse of a fallen 10 law enforcement officer or rescue worker, or a cohabitant:

11 (1) if the dwelling was owned by the disabled law enforcement officer or 12 rescue worker at the time the law enforcement officer or rescue worker was adjudged to be 13 permanently and totally disabled or by the fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker 14 at the time of the fallen law enforcement officer's or rescue worker's death;
