CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement
4 Program; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup;
5 prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but
6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to
7 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the
8 Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the
9 General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this
10 Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement
11 Program.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That:

14 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program.

15 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

16 (1) a representative of the Maryland Higher Education Commission,
17 appointed by the Secretary of Higher Education;

18 (2) the following representatives of public 4-year institutions of higher
19 education, including representatives of Administrative Affairs and Academic Affairs:

1 (i) a representative of the University System of Maryland,
2 appointed by the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland;

3 (ii) a representative of Morgan State University, appointed by the
4 President of Morgan State University; and

5 (iii) a representative of St. Mary's College of Maryland, appointed by
6 the President of St. Mary's College of Maryland;

7 (3) a representative of the Maryland Association of Community Colleges,
8 appointed by the Executive Director of the Maryland Association of Community Colleges;

9 (4) a representative of the Department of Budget and Management,
10 appointed by the Secretary of Budget and Management;

11 (5) a representative of the State Retirement Agency, appointed by the
12 Executive Director of the State Retirement Agency; and

13 (6) a representative of a bargaining unit for nonexempt employees,
14 appointed by the Governor.

15 (c) The Workgroup shall elect a chair from among its members.

16 (d) The University System of Maryland shall provide staff for the Workgroup.

17 (e) A member of the Workgroup:

18 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

19 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
20 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

21 (f) The Workgroup shall:

22 (1) review the population of employees eligible to participate in the
23 Optional Retirement Program, including:

24 (i) the number of employees in various employment categories, such
25 as exempt and nonexempt categories;

26 (ii) participation rates by employment categories; and

27 (iii) changes in participation rates over time;

28 (2) review the contribution requirements for the Optional Retirement
29 Program, including:

1 (i) the State contribution rate for participants of the Optional
2 Retirement Program; and

3 (ii) the appropriateness of an employee contribution for participants
4 of the Optional Retirement Program;

5 (3) review the eligibility criteria for health benefits of Optional Retirement
6 Program participants, including:

7 (i) the number of years of service participants in the Optional
8 Retirement Program are required to have to be eligible for retiree health benefits and a
9 prorated retiree health benefit subsidy;

10 (ii) the number of years of service participants in the Optional
11 Retirement Program are required to have for their spouses and dependents to be eligible
12 for retiree health benefits; and

13 (iii) whether any changes should be recommended to the eligibility
14 criteria for the Optional Retirement Program that would authorize a prorated retiree
15 health benefit subsidy for the spouses and dependents of participants of the Optional
16 Retirement Program; and

17 (4) make recommendations regarding any changes to the Optional
18 Retirement Program that would improve the Program and would be beneficial to the
19 participants in the Program and the State.

20 (g) On or before December 1, 2017, the Workgroup shall report its findings and
21 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State
22 Government Article, the General Assembly.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
24 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June
25 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
26 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
