CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:
- 14 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program.
- 15 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) a representative of the Maryland Higher Education Commission, 17 appointed by the Secretary of Higher Education;
- 18 (2) the following representatives of public 4-year institutions of higher 19 education, including representatives of Administrative Affairs and Academic Affairs:

23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June

1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June

30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be

abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
