# **SENATE BILL 356**

## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

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### Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement 4 Program; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup;  $\mathbf{5}$ prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to 6 7 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the 8 Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the 9 General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this 10 Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement 11 Program.

#### 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:

- 14 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study the Optional Retirement Program.
- 15 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) a representative of the Maryland Higher Education Commission, 17 appointed by the Secretary of Higher Education;
- (2) the following representatives of public 4-year institutions of higher
   education, including representatives of Administrative Affairs and Academic Affairs:
- 20 (i) a representative of the University System of Maryland, 21 appointed by the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland;
- (ii) a representative of Morgan State University, appointed by the
   President of Morgan State University; and

13 (4) make recommendations regarding any changes to the Optional 14 Retirement Program that would improve the Program and would be beneficial to the 15 participants in the Program and the State.

16 (g) On or before December 1, 2017, the Workgroup shall report its findings and 17 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 18 Government Article, the General Assembly.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 20 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 21 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 22 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
