## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Pharmacists – Contraceptives – Prescribing and Dispensing

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a pharmacist who meets the requirements of certain 4 regulations to prescribe and dispense certain contraceptives; requiring the State  $\mathbf{5}$ Board of Pharmacy to adopt regulations for pharmacists to prescribe and dispense 6 certain contraceptives; establishing certain requirements for the regulations; 7 requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland Children's 8 Health Program to provide coverage for certain contraceptive services rendered by a 9 licensed pharmacist to the same extent as the contraceptive services rendered by any other licensed health care practitioner; requiring certain insurers, nonprofit health 10 11 service plans, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for certain 12contraceptive services rendered by a licensed pharmacist to the same extent as the 13 contraceptive services rendered by any other licensed health care practitioner; 14 altering and adding certain definitions; providing for a delayed effective date; and 15generally relating to the prescribing and dispensing of contraceptives by 16pharmacists.

1(B)A PHARMACIST WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE REGULATIONS2ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE CONTRACEPTIVES.

3 (C) (1) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING THE 4 CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH A PHARMACIST MAY PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE 5 CONTRACEPTIVES.

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(2) THE REGULATIONS SHALL REQUIRE A PHARMACIST TO:

7 (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS 8 SUBSECTION, COMPLETE A TRAINING PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE BOARD FOR 9 PRESCRIBING AND DISPENSING CONTRACEPTIVES;

10 (II) PROVIDE A SELF-SCREENING RISK ASSESSMENT TOOL 11 THAT A PATIENT MUST USE BEFORE A PHARMACIST MAY PRESCRIBE 12 CONTRACEPTIVES FOR THE PATIENT; AND

(3) THE REGULATIONS SHALL WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT TO
 COMPLETE A TRAINING PROGRAM FOR A PHARMACIST WHO ALREADY HAS
 UNDERGONE THE TRAINING AS PART OF THE PHARMACIST'S FORMAL EDUCATIONAL
 PROGRAM.

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**Article – Insurance** 

2 **15–716.** 

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(A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO:

4 (1) INSURERS AND NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLANS THAT 5 PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR CONTRACEPTIVE DRUGS AND DEVICES UNDER 6 INDIVIDUAL, GROUP, OR BLANKET HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES OR CONTRACTS 7 THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE; AND

8 (2) HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE 9 COVERAGE FOR CONTRACEPTIVE DRUGS AND DEVICES UNDER INDIVIDUAL OR 10 GROUP CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE.

11 (B) AN ENTITY SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR 12 SERVICES RENDERED BY A LICENSED PHARMACIST UNDER § 12–511 OF THE 13 HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS COVERED UNDER A 14 POLICY OR CONTRACT ISSUED OR DELIVERED BY THE ENTITY, TO THE SAME EXTENT 15 AS SERVICES RENDERED BY ANY OTHER LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER, IN 16 SCREENING AN INDIVIDUAL AND PRESCRIBING CONTRACEPTIVES FOR THE 17 INDIVIDUAL.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 January 1, 2018.
