2 Income Tax – Subtraction Modification – Mortgage Forgiveness Debt Relief

3 FOR the purpose of allowing a subtraction modification under the Maryland income tax for 4 certain taxable years for income from the discharge of certain indebtedness related $\mathbf{5}$ to certain costs incurred with respect to a principal residence; providing that the 6 amount of the subtraction may not exceed a certain amount for certain taxpayers; 7 providing for the application of this Act; providing for the termination of certain 8 provisions of this Act; correcting an obsolete reference; and generally relating to an 9 income tax subtraction modification for income from the discharge of certain 10indebtedness.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take
effect July 1, 2017, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December
31, 2016, but before January 1, 2019. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and,
at the end of June 30, 2019, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

12 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 13 1, 2017, and, except as provided in Section 3 of this Act, shall be applicable to all taxable 14 years beginning after December 31, 2016.
