## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study the Feasibility of and Impact on Small and Minority
Businesses in Maryland Conducting Business Internationally

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of and Impact on 4 5 Small and Minority Businesses in Maryland Conducting Business Internationally; 6 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a 7 member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 8 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 9 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 10 11 before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Feasibility of and Impact on Small and Minority 12 13 Businesses in Maryland Conducting Business Internationally.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 15 That:
- 16 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Feasibility of and Impact on Small and Minority Businesses in Maryland Conducting Business Internationally.
- 18 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 19 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 20 the Senate:
- 21 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the 22 House;
- 23 (3) two members of the Legislative Black Caucus, appointed by the Chair 24 of the Legislative Black Caucus;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
