17 18 19	(a) To the extent practicable, on or before October 1, 2016, the Baltimore City Police Department and the Baltimore County Police Department each shall establish a behavioral health unit.

22 23	(1) to understand the needs of individuals with mental health, substance use, or co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders; and

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2 (c) (1) Training for officers in a behavioral health unit shall be developed in consultation with the Behavioral Health Administration in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

- 5 (2) THE TRAINING PROGRAM DEVELOPED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 6 THIS SUBSECTION SHALL CONSIST OF A MINIMUM OF **60** HOURS OF INSTRUCTION.
- 7 (d) The purpose of a behavioral health unit is to respond to emergency calls 8 involving an individual suspected of having a mental health, substance use, or co–occurring 9 mental health and substance use disorder.
- 10 (e) The goals of a behavioral health unit are to:
- 11 (1) divert individuals with mental health, substance use, or co-occurring 12 mental health and substance use disorders into treatment instead of the criminal justice 13 system; and
- 14 (2) prevent and reduce unnecessary use of force and loss of life in situations 15 involving individuals with mental health, substance use, or co–occurring mental health and 16 substance use disorders.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
