A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ACT concerning

Dental Hygienist – Scope of Practice – Authority to Practice Under General Supervision of Licensed Dentist

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain provision of law to provide that a general license to 5 practice dental hygiene authorizes the licensee to practice dental hygiene under the 6 general supervision of a licensed dentist in certain facilities with dentally 7 underserved populations, rather than only in a long-term care facility; altering the 8 requirements that a dental hygienist is required to meet before being authorized to 9 practice dental hygiene under the general supervision of a licensed dentist in certain facilities; altering the requirements that must be met by a dental hygienist who is 10 11 practicing under the general supervision of a licensed dentist in certain facilities and 12 performing a certain dental hygiene service; making conforming changes; defining 13 certain terms; repealing a certain definition; and generally relating to the authority 14 of dental hygienists to practice under the general supervision of licensed dentists.

16	1. REVIEW THE PRACTICE OF THE DENTAL HYGIENIST;

6 7 8	[(vi)] (X) Submit findings of [the] AN initial assessment to the supervising dentist for a COLLABORATIVE determination of future treatment BASED ON THE PATIENT'S OVERALL HEALTH STATUS.
9 10	(6) A dental hygienist may perform subsequent authorized dental hygiene services without the supervising dentist on the premises only if:
11	(i) The supervising dentist [examines]:
12 13	1. EXAMINES the [patient and authorizes] PATIENT'S CHARTS AND OTHER DENTAL RECORDS;
14 15	2. AUTHORIZES in the patient's record a prescription of specific treatment to be provided by the dental hygienist; AND
16 17	3. Examines the patient at least once every 12 months;
18 19 20 21	(ii) An authorized treatment is provided by the dental hygienist as soon as possible, but no later than [7] 12 months from the date the [patient was examined] PATIENT'S CHARTS AND OTHER DENTAL RECORDS WERE REVIEWED by the supervising dentist; and
22 23 24	(iii) Upon [expiration] COMPLETION of [a] THE prescribed treatment, the supervising dentist [is responsible for determining] AND THE DENTAL HYGIENIST JOINTLY DETERMINE future protocols for the treatment of the patient.
25 26	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017 .
