## Criminal Law – Animal Cruelty – Applicability

- FOR the purpose of clarifying that a person who has charge or custody of an animal and who unnecessarily fails to provide the animal with proper air, proper space, proper shelter, or proper protection from the weather is guilty of violating a certain prohibition against abuse or neglect of an animal; clarifying that a person who intentionally mutilates, intentionally tortures, intentionally cruelly beats, or intentionally cruelly kills an animal is guilty of violating a certain prohibition gainst aggravated cruelty to animals; and generally relating to animal cruelty.
