CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Animal Cruelty – Applicability**

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that a person who has charge or custody of an animal and
4 who unnecessarily fails to provide the animal with proper air, proper space, proper
5 shelter, or proper protection from the weather is guilty of violating a certain
6 prohibition against abuse or neglect of an animal; clarifying that a person who
7 intentionally mutilates, intentionally tortures, intentionally cruelly beats, or
8 intentionally cruelly kills an animal is guilty of violating a certain prohibition
9 against aggravated cruelty to animals; and generally relating to animal cruelty.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Criminal Law**

18 10–604.

19 (a) A person may not:

- 1 (1) overdrive or overload an animal;
- 2 (2) deprive an animal of necessary sustenance;
- 3 (3) inflict unnecessary suffering or pain on an animal;
- 4 (4) cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under item (1), (2), or (3)
- 5 of this subsection; or

6 (5) if the person has charge or custody of an animal, as owner or otherwise,

7 unnecessarily fail to provide the animal with:

8 (I) nutritious food in sufficient quantity[.];

9 (II) necessary veterinary care[.];

10 (III) proper drink[.];

11 (IV) **PROPER** air[.];

12 (V) **PROPER** space[.];

13 (VI) **PROPER** shelter[.]; or

14 (VII) **PROPER** protection from the weather.

15 (b) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on

16 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding \$1,000

17 or both.

18 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant convicted

19 of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological counseling.

20 (3) As a condition of probation, the court may prohibit a defendant from

21 owning, possessing, or residing with an animal.

22 10–606.

23 (a) A person may not:

24 (1) intentionally:

25 (I) mutilate[.];

26 (II) torture[.];

1 (III) cruelly beat[.]; or

2 (IV) cruelly kill an animal;

3 (2) cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under item (1) of this
4 subsection; or

5 (3) except in the case of self-defense, intentionally inflict bodily harm,
6 permanent disability, or death on an animal owned or used by a law enforcement unit.

7 (b) (1) A person who violates this section is guilty of the felony of aggravated
8 cruelty to animals and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a
9 fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.

10 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant convicted
11 of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological counseling.

12 (3) As a condition of probation, the court may prohibit a defendant from
13 owning, possessing, or residing with an animal.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2017.
