1 AN ACT concerning

State Government - Department of Veterans Affairs - Veterans' Services Specialists

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain units of State government to assign a full-time 5 employee of the unit as a veterans' services specialist to coordinate services with the 6 director of the veterans Outreach and Advocacy Program in the Department of 7 Veterans Affairs and attend certain training, to provide the Department of Veterans Affairs with certain information, and to post certain information on the unit's Web 8 9 site; making the Act applicable to certain units of State government; requiring 10 certain governmental units to direct veterans to contact the Department and provide 11 the veterans with certain contact information; and generally relating to veterans' 12 services specialists at units of State government.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 1 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - State Government 4 9-943. 5 For the purposes of reaching any veteran, veteran's dependent, or (a) (1) 6 veteran's survivor in need of assistance in obtaining services or benefits granted by the law, 7 the director shall develop and implement an outreach plan. 8 (2)In order to carry out the director's responsibilities under paragraph (1) 9 of this subsection, the director may: 10 (i) enter into contracts; and 11 (ii) work with governmental units and community-based 12organizations, including the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the Department 13 of Aging, faith-based groups, veterans groups, senior centers, adult day care centers, institutions of higher education, and other entities the director considers appropriate. 14 15 The director shall develop mechanisms for outreach to be disseminated by direct mail and through community-based veterans organizations, the Department of 16 17 Veterans Affairs, the Department of Human Resources, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and any other State agency or unit the director considers appropriate. 18 19 (2)The mechanisms for outreach shall include: 20the development of a pamphlet describing the services provided 21by the Outreach and Advocacy Program; 22(ii) a regular newsletter; 23brochures describing various benefits or any other issue or (iii) benefit of interest to veterans or their dependents; and 2425other measures the director considers appropriate. (iv) 26 The Department shall develop and maintain a database of veterans in the (c) 27 State. 28 The Department, in conjunction with the types of community-based 29 organizations listed in subsection (a)(2) of this section, shall develop a survey to assist in

identifying veterans and dependents who may be eligible for pension programs.

The Program shall:

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SERVICES SPECIALIST; AND

1 2 3	(III) A LINK TO THE DEPARTMENT WITH THE CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE DIRECTOR OF THE OUTREACH AND ADVOCACY PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.
4	(D) THE VETERANS' SERVICES SPECIALIST SHALL:
5 6	(1) COORDINATE THE PROVISION OF VETERANS' SERVICES AVAILABLE THROUGH THE UNIT WITH THE DEPARTMENT; AND
7 8	(2) ATTEND ANNUAL TRAINING THAT THE DEPARTMENT PROVIDES CONCERNING THE COORDINATION OF VETERANS' SERVICES.
9 10 11 12	(E) ON REQUEST FOR SERVICES BY A VETERAN, A GOVERNMENTAL UNIT THAT DOES NOT PROVIDE SERVICES TO VETERANS SHALL DIRECT THE VETERAN TO CONTACT THE DEPARTMENT AND PROVIDE THE VETERAN WITH THE DEPARTMENT CONTACT INFORMATION.
