BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Environment Section 9-1712 Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Environment 9-1712.(a) This section applies to any special event that: (1)
