AT A SPECIAL EVENT SUCH AS A WEDDING RECEPTION THAT THE BOARD APPROVES, A HOLDER OF A CLASS 3 WINERY LICENSE OR A CLASS 4 LIMITED WINERY LICENSE MAY SELL FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION BEER, LIGHT WINE PRODUCED AT THE WINERY OR AT ANOTHER WINERY, AND LIQUOR.

17 (a) There is a Class A light wine license in the county.

(b) The license may be issued to a holder of a Class 3 winery license or a Class 4limited winery license.

20 (c) (1) The license authorized the license holder to sell at retail at the place 21 described in the license light wine produced at the winery.

22 (2) Light wine shall be sold in a sealed package or container that may not 23 be opened or its contents consumed on the licensed premises.

(D) AT A SPECIAL EVENT SUCH AS A WEDDING RECEPTION THAT THE BOARD
APPROVES, THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY SELL FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION
BEER, LIGHT WINE PRODUCED AT THE WINERY OR AT ANOTHER WINERY, AND
LIQUOR.

28 [(d)] (E) The annual license fee is \$50.

 1, 2017.
