A BILL ENTITLED

3 FOR the purpose of specifying the scope and construction of certain provisions of law; 4 requiring the Department of State Police to develop a uniform basic permit for use $\mathbf{5}$ in connection with a low-voltage security system project and to make the uniform 6 basic permit available to certain local governments; specifying the terms for use of a 7 uniform basic permit; requiring a local government to take certain actions regarding 8 a certain uniform basic permit; prohibiting a local government from taking certain 9 actions against a certain contractor relating to a certain uniform basic permit; 10 prohibiting a local government from charging more than a certain fee for a uniform 11 basic permit; requiring a contractor to take certain actions relating to a certain 12uniform basic permit; requiring a local government that requires a uniform basic 13permit to develop and make available to a contractor a Uniform Notice of 14Low-Voltage Security System Project; specifying the contents of the Uniform Notice 15of Low–Voltage Security System Project; requiring a contractor to submit a Uniform Notice of Low-Voltage Security System Project to a local government within a 16 17certain amount of time after a certain date; authorizing a local government to 18 coordinate directly with an owner, a customer, a tenant, or an authorized 19representative to provide for the inspection of a certain low-voltage security system 20project; requiring a contractor to take corrective action if a low-voltage security 21 system project fails a certain inspection; prohibiting a local government from 22adopting or enforcing certain local laws or ordinances; prohibiting a local government 23from taking certain actions relating to a wireless security system; authorizing a local 24government to require certain individuals to register a security system with the local 25government; requiring a contractor or a security system monitoring agency to take 26certain actions to provide certain notice if a local government requires registration; 27requiring a certain contractor to provide a certain notice; requiring a certain 28individual, under certain circumstances, to register a security system with the 29applicable local government within a certain period of time; prohibiting a local 30 government from taking certain actions relating to registration of certain security 31systems; authorizing a local government to assess or impose a certain penalty or fine

8 (i) "Security systems agency" means an individual or a firm that conducts a 9 business that provides security systems services.

10 (j) "Security systems technician" means a person who personally provides 11 security systems services.

12 18–102.

(a) This title does not apply to an officer or employee of any unit of the United
States, of any state, or of any county, municipal corporation, or other political subdivision
of any state, while performing a duty of the office or employment.

16 (b) (1) This title does not supersede any local law or ordinance in the State 17 that establishes standards or qualifications for electricians or for electrical work involved 18 in the installation of security systems or security alarms.

19 (2) This title does not authorize an individual to perform electrical work 20 that otherwise requires an electrician's license under any State or local law or ordinance.

(3) Except as provided in paragraph (4) of this subsection, this title supersedes any local law or ordinance in the State that requires registration, training, bonding, or insurance for security systems technicians or other individuals who have access to circumventional information.

25 (4) This title does not preempt local governments from licensing or 26 regulating security system agencies or security system users.

27 (c) (1) The licensing requirements of this title do not apply to a master 28 electrician who:

(i) currently is licensed in that occupation under State or local law;and

- 31 (ii) is acting only within the scope of that occupation.
- 32 (2) A master electrician may not:

1 (i) personally provide security systems services unless the master 2 electrician is registered as a security systems technician; or

3 (ii) obtain access to circumventional information unless the master 4 electrician is registered as an individual with access to circumventional information.

5 (d) This title does not apply to a person who sells security systems at a retail 6 establishment or by means of a catalog or brochure for future delivery, provided that the 7 person does not:

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(1) enter the premises of the customer's property; or

9 (2) have access to circumventional information.

10 (e) This title does not apply to a commercial property owner or its authorized 11 agent performing the routine operation, including the changing of the passcodes, of a 12 security system that protects the premises of the owner's commercial property.

13 (f) This title may not be construed to require:

14 (1) a person engaged in the business of providing security systems services 15 for compensation to obtain more than one license under this title to provide security 16 systems services;

17 (2) a security systems technician, in addition to being registered under this 18 title, to obtain a license under this title, if the security systems technician is employed by 19 or under contract with a security systems agency; or

20 (3) an individual who is licensed under this title to be registered under 21 Subtitle 3A of this title.

7 (2) OPERATES AT A LOW VOLTAGE, AS DEFINED IN THE CURRENT 8 EDITION OF THE NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTION ASSOCIATION 70: NATIONAL 9 ELECTRICAL CODE.

16 (F) "UNIFORM BASIC PERMIT" MEANS A SINGLE-USE LABEL THAT A 17 CONTRACTOR PURCHASES FROM A LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO POST ON THE PREMISES 18 OF A LOW-VOLTAGE SECURITY SYSTEM PROJECT WHILE WORK IS BEING 19 PERFORMED.

(G) "UNIFORM NOTICE OF LOW-VOLTAGE SECURITY SYSTEM PROJECT"
 MEANS A NOTICE SUBMITTED TO A LOCAL GOVERNMENT WITHIN 14 DAYS AFTER THE
 DATE OF COMPLETION OF A LOW-VOLTAGE SECURITY SYSTEM PROJECT.

(H) "WIRELESS SECURITY SYSTEM" MEANS A SECURITY SYSTEM OR SMOKE
DETECTOR THAT IS NOT HARDWIRED AND ANY ANCILLARY COMPONENTS OR
EQUIPMENT CONNECTED TO THE SECURITY SYSTEM OR SMOKE DETECTOR.

16 (2) REQUESTING DISPATCH TO AN UNREGISTERED USER; OR

17 (3) EXCESSIVE FALSE ALARMS NOT ATTRIBUTED TO ERROR OR
 18 IMPROPER INSTALLATION BY THE CONTRACTOR OR SECURITY SYSTEM MONITORING
 19 AGENCY.
