

21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 11 (2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:
- 12 (i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1 13 year in good academic standing at the institution;
- 14 (ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application for a senatorial scholarship;
- 16 (iii) Is accepted for admission to a private career institution, if the 17 institution's curriculum is approved by the Commission, and the institution is accredited 18 by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of 19 Education; or
- 20 (iv) Is planning to attend or is attending a Maryland community 21 college.

- 26 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a senatorial scholarship 27 may be used only at any **COMMUNITY COLLEGE**, undergraduate, graduate, or professional 28 school in the State.

- 30 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to § 32 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:

- 1 (1) Is a full–time student;
- 2 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
- 3 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate 5 student each semester leading to a degree.
- 6 (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold 7 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if [he] THE RECIPIENT:
- 8 (1) Is a part–time student;
- 9 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and
- 10 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6 11 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.
- 12 (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one—half of the yearly 13 award for summer school.
- (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate program as provided in § 18–402(a) of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years if [he] THE RECIPIENT is a full-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if [he] THE RECIPIENT is a part-time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of this section.
- 20 (E) A RECIPIENT OF A SENATORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WHO IS CURRENTLY 21 ENROLLED, OR WAS ENROLLED WITHIN THE LAST 2 YEARS, IN A CERTIFICATE OR 22 LICENSE PROGRAM AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AS PROVIDED IN § 18–402(A)(3) OF 23 THIS SUBTITLE, MAY USE THE SCHOLARSHIP TO REIMBURSE EDUCATIONAL 24 EXPENSES AS DEFINED BY THE OFFICE UNDER § 18–405(B)(2) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- [(e)] (F) Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education:
- 28 (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of one program if the 29 student otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)(1) and (2) of this section; and
- 30 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the 31 institution for the completion of the program.

- 1 (a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded 2 under this subtitle.
  3 18-506.
- 4 (a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18–503 through 18–505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full–time undergraduate student enrolled at the University of Maryland, College Park Campus for the academic year commencing in that year.
- 10 (b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:
- 11 (1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one—half of the total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) of this section for that year;
- 13 (2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;
- 14 (3) May be used by:
- 15 (i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; [or]
- 16 (ii) A student at a private career school within the State that is 17 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11–202 of this article 18 and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United 19 States Department of Education; [and] OR
- 20 (III) A STUDENT WHO IS CURRENTLY ENROLLED OR WAS
  21 ENROLLED IN THE LAST 2 YEARS IN A CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM AT A
  22 COMMUNITY COLLEGE, APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION, AS REIMBURSEMENT FOR
  23 EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES; AND
- 24 (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the 25 Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate 26 to another student pursuant to this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
