A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Social Work Examiners – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of renaming the graduate social worker license issued by the State Board
4 of Social Work Examiners to be the master social worker license; limiting the number
5 of terms a certain licensed social worker member of the Board may serve; requiring
6 a certain licensed bachelor social worker or licensed master social worker to submit
7 certain information to the Board to obtain approval by the Board to engage in
8 independent practice; requiring the Board to approve an individual, under certain
9 circumstances, to engage in independent practice; repealing a provision of law
10 authorizing the Board to accept an alternate method of criminal history records
11 check under certain circumstances; requiring the Criminal Justice Information
12 System Central Repository to provide the Board with a certain revised statement
13 under certain circumstances; altering the factors the Board is required to consider
14 in using certain information obtained from the Central Repository to determine
15 whether to issue a license; requiring the Board to include whether a certain licensee
16 is approved to engage in independent practice on a certain electronic license record;
17 clarifying that certain licensees are prohibited from engaging in independent
18 practice except under certain circumstances; prohibiting a licensed master social
19 worker from engaging in independent practice on or after a certain date; altering
20 certain requirements for the supervision of licensed master social workers and
21 licensed certified social workers; prohibiting a licensed certified social worker from
22 engaging in independent practice; requiring, beginning in a certain calendar year
23 and except under certain circumstances, a licensee that renews a license to submit
24 certain evidence of having completed a State and national criminal history records
25 check in accordance with certain provisions of law; requiring a certain individual
26 applying to the Board for reactivation, reinstatement, or reissuance of a license to
27 submit certain evidence of having completed a State and national criminal history
28 records check in accordance with certain provisions of law; requiring the Board, in
29 using information obtained from the Central Repository to determine whether to
30 renew, reactivate, reinstate, or reissue a license, to consider certain factors;
31 prohibiting the Board from renewing, reactivating, reinstating, or reissuing a license

1 if the Board has not received certain criminal history records information; altering
 2 the circumstances under which the Board is required to place a licensee on
 3 nonrenewed status; clarifying that certain individuals who have been on inactive
 4 status or nonrenewed status for more than a certain number of years or who
 5 otherwise fail to apply for reactivation or renewal are required to apply for
 6 reissuance; altering the circumstances under which the Board is required to reissue
 7 a license to an individual; authorizing the Board to issue a cease and desist order or
 8 obtain injunctive relief for a violation of certain provisions of law; altering the
 9 manner by which certain licensees are required to make certain disclosures before
 10 providing social work services; establishing certain penalties; altering certain
 11 penalties; prohibiting the use of a certain abbreviation under certain circumstances;
 12 providing for continuity of licensure for certain licensees licensed by the Board on a
 13 certain date; authorizing certain individuals to apply for the reactivation,
 14 reinstatement, or reissuance of a certain license under certain circumstances;
 15 defining certain terms; altering certain definitions; making conforming changes;
 16 providing for the construction of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating
 17 to the State Board of Social Work Examiners.

29 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

30 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

33 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

34 (b) “Board” means the State Board of Social Work Examiners.

35 (c) “Certified” means having demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Board that
 36 the individual has completed 2 years of supervised social work practice as defined in §
 37 19–302(d) or (e) of this title.

1 **(D) “INDEPENDENT PRACTICE” MEANS TO PRACTICE BACHELOR SOCIAL**
2 **WORK OR MASTER SOCIAL WORK WITHOUT THE REQUIREMENT OF SUPERVISION BY**
3 **ANOTHER SOCIAL WORKER.**

4 **[(d)] (E)** “License” means, unless the context requires otherwise, one of four
5 types of licenses issued by the Board authorizing an individual to practice:

- 6 (1) Bachelor social work;
- 7 (2) **[Graduate] MASTER** social work;
- 8 (3) Certified social work; or
- 9 (4) Certified social work—clinical.

10 **[(e)] (F)** “Licensed bachelor social worker” means an individual licensed by the
11 Board to practice bachelor social work.

12 **[(f)] (G)** “Licensed certified social worker” means an individual licensed by the
13 Board to practice certified social work.

14 **[(g)] (H)** “Licensed certified social worker—clinical” means an individual licensed
15 by the Board to practice clinical social work.

16 **[(h)] (I)** “Licensed graduate social worker” means an individual licensed by the
17 Board, **ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2017**, to practice graduate social work.

18 **(J) “LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKER” MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL**
19 **LICENSED BY THE BOARD, ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2017, TO PRACTICE MASTER**
20 **SOCIAL WORK.**

21 **[(i)] (K)** “Practice bachelor social work” means to **[practice social work] USE**
22 **THE EDUCATION AND TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER § 19–302(B) OF THIS TITLE TO:**

23 (1) **[Under] PRACTICE SOCIAL WORK UNDER** the supervision of a
24 licensed certified social worker, licensed certified social worker—clinical, **[or] licensed**
25 **[graduate] MASTER** social worker, **OR LICENSED BACHELOR SOCIAL WORKER** who
26 meets the conditions specified in regulations; **[and] OR**

27 **[(2)] Utilizing the education and training required under § 19–302(b) of this**
28 **title.]**

29 **(2) IF APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 19–302(F)**
30 **OF THIS TITLE, ENGAGE IN INDEPENDENT PRACTICE.**

1 **[(j)] (L) (1)** “Practice certified social work” means to **USE THE EDUCATION,**
 2 **TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE REQUIRED UNDER § 19–302(D) OF THIS TITLE TO**
 3 practice social work [utilizing the education, training, and experience required under §
 4 19–302(d) of this title].

5 **(2) “PRACTICE CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORK” INCLUDES:**

6 **(I) FORMULATING A DIAGNOSIS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A**
 7 **LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL;**

8 **(II) TREATING BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS; AND**

9 **(III) TREATING MENTAL DISORDERS AND PROVIDING**
 10 **PSYCHOTHERAPY UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL**
 11 **WORKER–CLINICAL.**

12 **[(k)] (M) (1)** “Practice clinical social work” means to **USE THE SPECIALIZED**
 13 **EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE REQUIRED UNDER § 19–302(E) OF THIS**
 14 **TITLE TO** practice social work [utilizing the specialized education, training, and experience
 15 required under § 19–302(e) of this title].

16 **(2) “PRACTICE CLINICAL SOCIAL WORK” INCLUDES:**

17 **(I) EVALUATING, DIAGNOSING, AND TREATING**
 18 **BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS, MENTAL AND EMOTIONAL CONDITIONS AND**
 19 **IMPAIRMENTS, AND MENTAL DISORDERS AS DEFINED IN § 10–101 OF THE**
 20 **HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE;**

21 **(II) PETITIONING FOR EMERGENCY EVALUATION UNDER TITLE**
 22 **10, SUBTITLE 6, PART IV OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE; AND**

23 **(III) PROVIDING PSYCHOTHERAPY.**

24 **[(l)] (N) (1)** “Practice graduate social work” means, **ON OR BEFORE**
 25 **SEPTEMBER 31, 2017,** to **HAVE USED THE EDUCATION AND TRAINING REQUIRED TO**
 26 **OBTAIN A MASTER SOCIAL WORK LICENSE UNDER § 19–302(C) OF THIS TITLE TO**
 27 practice social work[:

28 **(1) Under] UNDER** the supervision of a licensed certified social worker,
 29 licensed certified social worker–clinical, or licensed graduate social worker who meets the
 30 conditions specified in regulations[; and

31 **(2) Utilizing** the education and training required under § 19–302(c) of this
 32 title].

1 **(2) “PRACTICE GRADUATE SOCIAL WORK” INCLUDES HAVING:**

2 **(I) FORMULATED A DIAGNOSIS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A**
3 **LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL;**

4 **(II) TREATED BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS; AND**

5 **(III) TREATED MENTAL DISORDERS AND PROVIDED**
6 **PSYCHOTHERAPY UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL**
7 **WORKER–CLINICAL.**

8 **(O) (1) “PRACTICE MASTER SOCIAL WORK” MEANS TO USE THE**
9 **EDUCATION AND TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER § 19–302(C) OF THIS TITLE TO:**

10 **(I) PRACTICE SOCIAL WORK UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A**
11 **LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER, LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL**
12 **WORKER–CLINICAL, OR LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKER WHO MEETS THE**
13 **CONDITIONS SPECIFIED IN REGULATIONS; OR**

14 **(II) IF APPROVED BY THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH §**
15 **19–302(F) OF THIS TITLE, ENGAGE IN INDEPENDENT PRACTICE.**

16 **(2) “PRACTICE MASTER SOCIAL WORK” INCLUDES:**

17 **(I) FORMULATING A DIAGNOSIS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A**
18 **LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL;**

19 **(II) TREATING BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS; AND**

20 **(III) TREATING MENTAL DISORDERS AND PROVIDING**
21 **PSYCHOTHERAPY UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL**
22 **WORKER–CLINICAL.**

23 **[(m)] (P) (1) “Practice social work” means to apply the theories, knowledge,**
24 **procedures, methods, or ethics derived from [a formal educational] RECEIVING A**
25 **BACCALAUREATE OR MASTER’S DEGREE FROM A program in social work THAT IS**
26 **ACCREDITED BY OR A CANDIDATE FOR ACCREDITATION BY THE COUNCIL ON SOCIAL**
27 **WORK EDUCATION, OR AN EQUIVALENT ORGANIZATION APPROVED BY THE**
28 **COUNCIL ON SOCIAL WORK EDUCATION, to restore or enhance social functioning of**
29 **individuals, couples, families, groups, organizations, or communities through:**

30 **(i) Assessment;**

- 1 (ii) Planning;
- 2 (iii) Intervention;
- 3 (iv) Evaluation of intervention plans;
- 4 (v) Case management;
- 5 (vi) Information and referral;
- 6 (vii) Counseling that does not include diagnosis or treatment of
7 mental disorders;
- 8 (viii) Advocacy;
- 9 (ix) Consultation;
- 10 (x) Education;
- 11 (xi) Research;
- 12 (xii) Community organization; [or]
- 13 (xiii) Development, implementation, and administration of policies,
14 programs, and activities;

15 **(XIV) BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES, INCLUDING THE**
16 **TREATMENT OF SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS; OR**

17 **(XV) SUPERVISION OF OTHER SOCIAL WORKERS AS SET FORTH**
18 **IN REGULATIONS.**

19 [(2) For an individual licensed as a graduate social worker, “practice social
20 work” also includes:

- 21 (i) Supervision of other social workers if the graduate social worker
22 meets the requirements set out in regulations;
- 23 (ii) Formulating a diagnosis, under the direct supervision of a
24 licensed certified social worker–clinical;
- 25 (iii) Treatment of biopsychosocial conditions; and
- 26 (iv) Treatment of mental disorders and the provision of
27 psychotherapy under the direct supervision of a licensed certified social worker–clinical.

1 (3) For an individual licensed as a certified social worker, “practice social
2 work” also includes:

3 (i) Supervision of other social workers;

4 (ii) Formulating a diagnosis, under the direct supervision of a
5 licensed certified social worker–clinical;

6 (iii) Treatment of biopsychosocial conditions; and

7 (iv) Treatment of mental disorders and the provision of
8 psychotherapy under the direct supervision of a licensed certified social worker–clinical.

9 (4) For an individual licensed as a certified social worker–clinical, “practice
10 social work” also includes:

11 (i) Supervision of other social workers;

12 (ii) Evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment of biopsychosocial
13 conditions, mental and emotional conditions and impairments, and mental disorders as
14 defined in § 10–101(i) of the Health – General Article;

15 (iii) Petitioning for emergency evaluation under Title 10, Subtitle 6
16 of the Health – General Article; and

17 (iv) The provision of psychotherapy.]

18 **(2) “PRACTICE SOCIAL WORK” INCLUDES USING TECHNOLOGY AS SET**
19 **FORTH IN REGULATIONS.**

20 **(Q) “PRIVATE PRACTICE” MEANS THE PROVISION OF PSYCHOTHERAPY BY A**
21 **LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL WHO ASSUMES RESPONSIBILITY**
22 **AND ACCOUNTABILITY FOR THE NATURE AND QUALITY OF THE SERVICES PROVIDED**
23 **TO A CLIENT IN EXCHANGE FOR DIRECT PAYMENT OR THIRD–PARTY**
24 **REIMBURSEMENT.**

25 **[(n)] (R) “Psychotherapy” means the assessment and treatment of mental**
26 **disorders and behavioral disturbances.**

27 **(S) “REACTIVATION” MEANS THE PROCESS OF OBTAINING A LICENSE LESS**
28 **THAN 5 YEARS AFTER THE BOARD PLACED AN INDIVIDUAL ON INACTIVE STATUS.**

29 **(T) “REINSTATEMENT” MEANS THE PROCESS OF OBTAINING A LICENSE**
30 **LESS THAN 5 YEARS AFTER THE BOARD PLACED AN INDIVIDUAL ON NONRENEWED**
31 **STATUS.**

1 **(U) “REISSUANCE” MEANS THE PROCESS OF OBTAINING A LICENSE MORE**
 2 **THAN 5 YEARS AFTER THE BOARD PLACED AN INDIVIDUAL ON INACTIVE OR**
 3 **NONRENEWED STATUS.**

4 **[(o)] (V)** “Supervision” means a formalized professional relationship between a
 5 supervisor and a supervisee that:

6 (1) Provides evaluation and direction of the supervisee; and

7 (2) Promotes continued development of the supervisee’s knowledge, skills,
 8 and abilities to provide social work services in an ethical and competent manner.

10 (a) (2) Of the 12 Board members:

11 (i) 10 shall be licensed social workers of whom:

12 1. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, 1 is a licensed
 13 bachelor social worker;

14 2. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, 1 is a licensed
 15 **[graduate] MASTER** social worker at the time of appointment;

16 3. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, at least 1 is a
 17 licensed certified social worker;

18 4. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, at least 4 are
 19 licensed certified social workers—clinical;

20 5. 1 is a licensed social worker employed by the Department
 21 of Human Resources; and

22 6. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, 1 is a licensed
 23 social worker who is:

24 A. Primarily engaged in social worker education at a social
 25 work program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education; and

26 B. Nominated from a list of names submitted by the deans
 27 and directors of the Maryland Social Work Education Programs; and

28 (ii) 2 shall be consumer members.

29 (3) If a licensed bachelor social worker, a licensed **[graduate] MASTER**
 30 social worker, a licensed certified social worker, a licensed certified social worker—clinical,

1 or a licensed social worker is not appointed to the Board under paragraph (2)(i) of this
2 subsection within 3 months of a vacancy, a licensee of any license level shall be appointed
3 immediately if that licensee is qualified to be a member of the Board under subsections (b)
4 and (d) of this section.

5 (d) Except for the licensed bachelor social worker member and the licensed
6 [graduate] MASTER social worker member, each social worker member of the Board shall
7 have been licensed in the State for 5 years immediately preceding the appointment and
8 actively employed in the field of social work for at least 3 of the 5 years immediately
9 preceding the appointment.

10 (g) (5) (I) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS
11 PARAGRAPH, A member may not serve more than 2 consecutive full terms.

12 (II) A LICENSED SOCIAL WORKER MEMBER WHO IS NOMINATED
13 IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A)(2)(I)6B OF THIS SECTION MAY NOT SERVE
14 MORE THAN 1 FULL TERM.

15 19–302.

16 (a) To obtain a license, an applicant shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the
17 Board that the applicant:

18 (1) Has submitted a complete written application in the form prescribed by
19 the Board;

20 (2) Is at least 18 years old;

21 (3) Is of good moral character;

22 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this title, has successfully passed an
23 examination or examinations prescribed by the Board pertinent to the license sought;

24 (5) Has paid all applicable fees specified by the Board;

25 (6) Has completed a criminal history records check in accordance with §
26 19–302.2 of this subtitle at the applicant's expense; and

27 (7) Has submitted to an examination if required under § 19–302.3 of this
28 subtitle.

29 (b) To obtain a bachelor social worker license, an applicant shall:

30 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section; and

1 (2) Have received a baccalaureate degree in social work from a program
2 that is accredited or is a candidate for accreditation by the Council on Social Work
3 Education or an equivalent organization approved by the Council on Social Work
4 Education.

5 (c) To obtain a [graduate] **MASTER** social worker license, an applicant shall:

6 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section; and

7 (2) Have received a master's degree from a program that is accredited or is
8 a candidate for accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent
9 organization approved by the Council on Social Work Education.

10 (d) Except as provided in § 19–302.1 of this subtitle, to obtain a certified social
11 worker license, an applicant shall:

12 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section;

13 (2) Have received a master's degree from a program accredited by the
14 Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the Council
15 on Social Work Education; and

16 (3) Provide in a form prescribed by the Board, documentation of having
17 completed 2 years as a licensee with supervised experience of at least 3,000 hours after
18 receiving the master's degree with a minimum of 100 hours of periodic face-to-face
19 supervision in the practice of social work under the terms and conditions that the Board
20 determines by regulation.

21 (e) Except as provided in § 19–302.1 of this subtitle, to obtain a certified social
22 worker-clinical license, an applicant shall:

23 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section;

24 (2) Have received a master's degree in social work and documentation of
25 completion of 12 academic credits in clinical course work from a program accredited by the
26 Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the Council
27 on Social Work Education, with a minimum of 6 of the 12 academic credits obtained in a
28 master's degree program; and

29 (3) Provide in a form prescribed by the Board, documentation of having
30 completed 2 years as a licensee with supervised experience of at least 3,000 hours, of which
31 1,500 hours are in face-to-face client contact, after receiving the master's degree with a
32 minimum of 144 hours of periodic face-to-face supervision in the assessment, formulation
33 of a diagnostic impression, and treatment of mental disorders and other conditions and the
34 provision of psychotherapy under the terms and conditions that the Board determines by
35 regulation.

1 **(F) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION,**
2 **TO OBTAIN APPROVAL BY THE BOARD TO ENGAGE IN INDEPENDENT PRACTICE, A**
3 **LICENSED BACHELOR SOCIAL WORKER OR A LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKER**
4 **SHALL SUBMIT TO THE BOARD:**

5 **(I) AN APPLICATION IN THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE**
6 **BOARD;**

7 **(II) ALL APPLICABLE FEES SPECIFIED BY THE BOARD; AND**

8 **(III) DOCUMENTATION IN A FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE BOARD**
9 **OF HAVING COMPLETED AT LEAST 3 YEARS AS A LICENSEE WITH SUPERVISED**
10 **EXPERIENCE OF AT LEAST 4,500 HOURS AFTER RECEIVING THE BACCALAUREATE OR**
11 **MASTER'S DEGREE WITH A MINIMUM OF 150 HOURS OF PERIODIC FACE-TO-FACE**
12 **SUPERVISION UNDER THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES**
13 **BY REGULATION.**

14 **(2) THE BOARD SHALL APPROVE AN INDIVIDUAL TO ENGAGE IN**
15 **INDEPENDENT PRACTICE IF THE INDIVIDUAL:**

16 **(I) SUBMITS TO THE BOARD:**

17 **1. AN APPLICATION IN THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE**
18 **BOARD; AND**

19 **2. ALL APPLICABLE FEES SPECIFIED BY THE BOARD;**

20 **(II) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2007, WAS LICENSED BY THE**
21 **BOARD AS A LICENSED BACHELOR SOCIAL WORKER OR A LICENSED GRADUATE**
22 **SOCIAL WORKER; AND**

23 **(III) HAS PRACTICED BACHELOR SOCIAL WORK, PRACTICED**
24 **GRADUATE SOCIAL WORK, OR PRACTICED MASTER SOCIAL WORK FOR AT LEAST 10**
25 **YEARS.**

26 **(3) NOTHING IN THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT**
27 **AN EMPLOYER FROM REQUIRING SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED BACHELOR SOCIAL**
28 **WORKER OR A LICENSED MASTER SOCIAL WORKER WHO IS APPROVED TO ENGAGE**
29 **IN INDEPENDENT PRACTICE UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.**

31 **(a) In this section, "Central Repository" means the Criminal Justice Information**
32 **System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.**

1 (b) As part of an application to the Central Repository for a State and national
2 criminal history records check, an applicant shall submit to the Central Repository:

3 (1) A complete set of legible fingerprints taken on forms approved by the
4 Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation;

5 (2) The fee authorized under § 10–221(b)(7) of the Criminal Procedure
6 Article for access to State criminal history records; and

7 (3) The processing fee required by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for
8 a national criminal history records check.

9 (c) In accordance with §§ 10–201 through 10–228 of the Criminal Procedure
10 Article, the Central Repository shall forward to the Board and to the applicant the criminal
11 history record information of the applicant.

12 [(d) If an applicant has made two or more unsuccessful attempts at securing
13 legible fingerprints, the Board may accept an alternate method of criminal history records
14 check as permitted by the Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal
15 Bureau of Investigation.]
