Prince George's County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class BLX License – Movie Theaters

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Prince George's County Board of License $\mathbf{5}$ Commissioners to issue a Class BLX (on-premises) beer, wine, and liquor license for 6 use in a movie theater with average daily receipts from the sale of certain food that 7 exceed the average daily receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages; establishing 8 an investment requirement for a license applicant if the movie theater is located in 9 a certain area: establishing the hours for sale under the Class BLX movie theater 10 license; providing that the holder of a Class BLX movie theater license may serve 11 only certain customers; making certain conforming changes; and generally relating 12 to the issuance of Class BLX beer, wine, and liquor licenses for use in movie theaters.
