CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners - Members - Appointment and Removal FOR the purpose of establishing the Baltimore City Public School Board Community Panel; providing for the purpose and composition of the panel; authorizing the Mayor of Baltimore City to request the panel to reconvene under certain circumstances; requiring the panel to reconvene for a certain purpose; repealing the role of the Governor in making certain appointments to, filling certain vacancies on, and removing certain members from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners; requiring the Mayor of Baltimore City to appoint certain members of the board and fill certain vacancies from a list of qualified individuals submitted by a certain panel; establishing the Baltimore City Public School Board Community Panel; providing for the purpose and composition of the panel; and generally relating to the appointment and removal of the members of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners.
