# Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners – Members – Appointment and Removal

FOR the purpose of establishing the Baltimore City Public School Board Community Panel; 4 providing for the purpose and composition of the panel; authorizing the Mayor of  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Baltimore City to request the panel to reconvene under certain circumstances; 7 requiring the panel to reconvene for a certain purpose; repealing the role of the Governor in making certain appointments to, filling certain vacancies on, and 8 9 removing certain members from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners; 10 requiring the Mayor of Baltimore City to appoint certain members of the board and 11 fill certain vacancies from a list of qualified individuals submitted by a certain panel; establishing the Baltimore City Public School Board Community Panel; providing 12 for the purpose and composition of the panel; and generally relating to the 13appointment and removal of the members of the Baltimore City Board of School 14 Commissioners. 15
