 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Human Trafficking Advisory Council to 6 serve as a nongovernmental advisory body to certain bodies regarding human 7 trafficking in the State and outside the State; providing for the duties of the Council; providing for the composition, chair, staffing, and terms of the membership on the 8 9 Council: requiring the Council to meet at certain times; requiring the Council to 10 submit a certain report on or before certain dates; prohibiting a member of the 11 Council from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Governor to appoint the initial members of the 12Council within a certain time period; providing for the termination of this Act; and 13generally relating to the Human Trafficking Advisory Council extending the 14 termination date for the Workgroup to Study Safe Harbor Policy for Youth Victims 1516 of Human Trafficking; requiring the Workgroup to submit certain supplemental reports on or before certain dates; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study 17Safe Harbor Policy for Youth Victims of Human Trafficking. 18
