1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Intestate Estates – Inheritance by Surviving Parent – Repeal**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain provision of law allowing a surviving parent to
4 inherit certain intestate property if there is a surviving spouse but no surviving
5 issue; and generally relating to intestate property inherited by a surviving spouse.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Estates and Trusts**

14 3–102.

15 (a) The share of a surviving spouse shall be as provided in this section.

16 (b) If there is a surviving minor child, the share shall be one-half.

1 (c) If there is no surviving minor child, but there is surviving issue, the share
2 shall be the first \$15,000 plus one-half of the residue.

3 [(d) If there is no surviving issue but a surviving parent, the share shall be the
4 first \$15,000 plus one-half of the residue.]

5 [(e) (D) If there is no surviving issue [or parent], the share shall be the whole
6 estate.

7 [(f) (E) For the purposes of this section, the net estate shall be calculated
8 without a deduction for the tax as defined in § 7-308 of the Tax – General Article.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 2017.
