2 **State Lottery and Gaming Control Agency – Procurements**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that certain procurements made through competitive sealed
4 bids or competitive sealed proposals by the State Lottery and Gaming Control
5 Agency be awarded to the responsible bidder or offeror who submits the lowest
6 responsive bid or proposal under certain circumstances; making this Act an
7 emergency measure; and generally relating to procurements made by the State
8 Lottery and Gaming Control Agency.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

18 **NOTWITHSTANDING §§ 13–103 AND 13–104 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND SUBJECT**
19 **TO TITLE 14 OF THIS ARTICLE, A PROCUREMENT MADE THROUGH COMPETITIVE**

1 SEALED BIDS OR COMPETITIVE SEALED PROPOSALS BY THE STATE LOTTERY AND
2 GAMING CONTROL AGENCY SHALL BE AWARDED TO THE RESPONSIBLE BIDDER OR
3 OFFEROR WHO SUBMITS THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE BID OR PROPOSAL.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act ~~shall take effect~~
5 ~~October 1, 2017~~ is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of
6 the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths
7 of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall
8 take effect from the date it is enacted.
